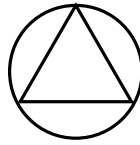

## FROM THE ARCHIVES Before the Big Book

While sorting papers, there was this advertisement for books by Dick B. titled *Early AA Comes Alive*. The information refers specifically to AA around the Akron, Cleveland area.

- The AA fellowship today is far different than that of the formative years of the late 1930's.
- Early AA was an integral part of "a First Century Christian Fellowship" (also known as the Oxford Group)
- Early AA's borrowed most of their basic ideas from the Bible. (called the Good Book)
- Dr. Bob referred to early A.A. meetings in Akron as "Christian Fellowship."
- "Drunkalogs"---as they are known today ---rarely, if ever, occurred at early meetings. Instead, drinking stories were shared with the newcomer during his hospitalization.
- Hospitalization was usually a must. It was done to avoid seizures and defog the newcomer. It lasted about seven days and the only literature allowed in the hospital room was the Bible.
- "Surrender" --at the hospital or at an early meeting was a requirement for participation in the fellowship.
- New Age, "self-help," psychobabble and whining were not part of the pioneer AA program.

Early AA's program was focused on just a few basic points:

1. Admitting that alcohol had become the master and that life had become unmanageable.
2. Seeking Divine help through Bible study, prayer, guidance and fellowship.
3. Changing "sinful" behavior and traits through rebirth and God's forgiveness.
4. Establishing a relationship with God which maximized services to God and others by making restitution for wrongs done, witnessing, fellowship and putting love into practice.

A nominating committee is now searching for candidates willing to stand for any of these positions. #### **NINTH TRADITION**
