### The Power of Choice

I have the power of choice to keep my current sobriety date. I do this by choosing to stay in the proverbial "middle of the AA bed", by applying the steps - not just talking about them, by being an active member in good standing (unity, recovery and service), and by choosing not to pick up a drink one day at a time.

When I first came into AA, I had lost the power of choice over drink. As my disease progressed, I lost the power of choice in lots of areas and my life was painful. The beauty of pain and powerlessness is that it made it easy to throw in the towel and commit to the "rarely have we seen a person fail who has thoroughly followed our path" principal. I surrendered to the will of the God of my understanding and I have since been pleasantly surprised by the quality and quantity of power in my life that I can get everyday.

I have the power to choose my feelings. During my 5<sup>th</sup> Step, I discovered that a lot of my feelings were emotional reactions from a historical perspective. I was big on "I'm so mad at you - look what you made me do! You make me so mad - I hate you!!!!"

A positive attitude is also my choice. Staying sober through adversity has taught me that silver linings surround every cloud in my life. When I look back at tough times, I see how something good always came out of it. My DUI led me to the rooms of AA. That's a good thing. So when times get tough, I choose to remain positive because "this too shall pass".

I have the power to choose people who bring joy, serenity and comfort to my life. I no longer seem to have any stamina for people who bring pain, chaos and discomfort into my life.

So, because of the power I get through the God of my understanding, I have the power of choice. Power to choose things I can control, power to choose my feelings, power to choose my attitudes, and the power to choose who I want to be in my life. Because of all of this, I have the power to keep my sobriety date for as long as I choose.

### Thoughts on the Twelve Traditions

By Richmond Walker

- Tradition I - bring God into AA life to achieve unity through faith and humility to put our common welfare first.
- Tradition II - For our group purpose there is but one ultimate authority—a loving God as He may express Himself in our group conscience. Our leaders are but trusted servants; they do not govern.
- Tradition III - Simple membership requirements are important, sign nothing, agree to nothing, promise nothing: wishing to do something about the problem is enough.
- Tradition IV - Although managing their affairs exactly as they please, each group's sole purpose must be sobriety.
- Tradition V - Don't complicate the message of sobriety; keep the gift by giving it away.
- Tradition VI - "Clubs and drying out places should be separate from AA." AA should not go into business and distract from its message.
- Tradition VII - Outsiders should not be able to influence the affairs of AA because of their contributions.
- Tradition VIII - "Freely ye have received, freely give." Paid employees are needed to keep the wheels running but 12 step work is the return for what we have received.
- Tradition IX - Service centers help us reach the suffering alcoholic. Communication needs to be maintained. We are motivated through fellowship not organization.
- Tradition X - Opinions on outside issues will destroy unity and fellowship.
- Tradition XI - "Personal ambition has no place in AA."
- Tradition XII - "Anonymity is real humility at work."

DOS June 15, 1958

During his first ten years of priesthood, Joseph M's drinking became excessive and his behavior became more erratic. Despite repeated warnings, he was unable to get his drinking under control. On June 15, 1958, he was sent to treatment at Guest House, a treatment center for the clergy. There, with the help and guidance of two recovered alcoholics, Austin R and Walter G, Father Martin began his journey in sobriety. Father Martin has always credited both men for teaching him everything he knows about alcoholism.

Father Martin's talks with Austin R and Walter G became the basis of his famous "Chalk Talks", a series of lectures that have been heard by thousands of people around the world. "Chalk Talk" would eventually become his most popular presentation even being used by the US government, the armed forces, companies, hospitals, rehabilitation centers, and many state and city alcohol programs.

Father Martin died of heart disease at his home in Havre de Grace, Maryland, on March 9, 2009. His burial Mass took place at the Baltimore Basilica on Friday, March 13, 2009.
