Then One Day, They Were Gone

In my first year of sobriety, my marriage failed and I moved to a new house. I was on my 4th step... working on it...and working on it. Obviously, I was dragging my feet - I didn't like the feelings that were coming up.

Okay, back to the new house. I was so thrilled that I found a house for really low rent - okay, so the neighborhood was dangerous, but hey - the rent! In the middle of the third night, I went to the kitchen to get some water. When the light came on, my heart jumped into my throat. Bugs! Bugs everywhere! More specifically, roaches! Basically, I don't do bugs. My history with bugs was jumping on top of chairs screaming, "Honey! Come here quick!! There, there, over there!!!! Kill it!!! KILL IT!!! Can I come down now? Is it gone? Piece of fuzz? Why, I thought that was a bug!!!"

But clearly, my Higher Power had other ideas, because here I was, no handy spousal bug killer, in a strange house, in the middle of the night, in the middle of a colony of cockroaches. Then it hit me. As long as I didn't turn on my "lights", I didn't have to see the bugs inside of me. Once the lights were turned on, I couldn't deny that the bugs were there. Suddenly, just like the cockroaches surrounding me, I knew that the bugs in me had to go, too.

The ensuing bug war included drilling holes in the walls and leaving the house for three days. Over the days, the bugs got smaller and smaller as the babies stopped maturing, and then one day they were gone. Over those same weeks, I tackled my inventory. By dragging my feet on the inventory, the "bugs" thrived in colonies built into my spiritual walls. Only a major extermination, like a fourth step inventory, could get those squatters out. I became very willing and finally, the bugs got smaller and smaller, and then one day, they were gone.

GSO Frequently Asked Questions, Box 459, Spring 2011:

Q. What is an A.A. event?

A. As far as we are concerned, any event which is run by AA's, about AA, and for AA's is an AA event. Some are under the auspices of regions, areas or districts; other of central offices or intergroups or even groups; and still others of a committee of AA members. Al-Anon's are included in some events. Many of the events are service-connected, others are purely for AA.

Q. We are planning to hold a roundup in our city, and wonder if it's okay to ask groups for seed money?

A. This can be answered only by the group conscience of the groups concerned. However, if the group agrees to take a collection at its meeting to support the roundup, a separate basket for this specific purpose is often passed for those who wish to give, rather than taking money from the group funds.

Q. Is it okay to hold a dance (no meeting) as a fundraiser for an AA function?

A. If tickets for the dance are sold within the Fellowship, it's up to the group conscience; if they're sold outside, it's a clear violation of the 7th Tradition. Dances themselves are a popular feature of AA conventions and get-togethers.

“The Four Absolutes”

A recent addition to our archives is a little pamphlet printed by the Cleveland Central Committee (no date) titled “The Four Absolutes.” The Four Absolutes actually originated in 1902 in a book by Dr. Robert E. Speer, that included four moral principles most commonly called the Four Standards. The term “Absolutes” was later coined by Professor Henry B. Wright of Yale and eventually, the Four Absolutes were adopted by Dr. Frank Buchman, Founder of the Oxford Group. Early Akron AAs, while asking God to take alcohol out of their lives, would also ask for help in living up to these four standards. Bill Wilson criticized the Four Absolutes and several other Oxford Group principles and practices. By contrast, Dr. Bob Smith consistently favored application of the Four Absolutes as did his wife Anne, Henrietta Seiberling, T. Henry, and Clarence Williams. Today, the Four Absolutes are commonly referred to by old-timers or members who got sober in Akron or Cleveland. The Absolutes are not repeated in the 12 Steps and Traditions but the thoughts form thread through the Steps.

Honesty - the search for the truth. This is perhaps the most difficult to achieve of the four Absolutes. By being honest in our interaction with others, we encourage honesty in others as well. “Sobriety is a gift but honesty is a grace we must earn and fight to protect.”

Unselfishness - includes not only what we do for others but also what we do for ourselves. We must maintain our own sobriety before we can help others. “Our aid to others comes from the example of our own lives.”

Purity - the desire to do that what is right. We drank to not face the reality of doing wrong. Purity comes through turning our will and our life over to the care of God with the Third and Eleventh Steps. Purity is simply doing the right thing for the right reason. “The journey is just as important as the destination.”

Love - We felt completely unloved in our alcoholic despair. We were steeped in self-pity. Once in the program we received love and understanding from strangers and we give it to new strangers. We show love by sharing our experience with others which is the Twelfth Step. “Love is a poor man’s beginning toward God.”

The steps represent our philosophy, The Four Absolutes, our objectives. We ask ourselves these four questions to guide us in applying the Four Absolutes and as a way to check our motives:

“Is it true or false?”

“How will it affect the other fellow?”

“Is it right or wrong?”

“Is it ugly or beautiful?”

The Fourth Tradition

Each group should be autonomous except in matters affecting other groups or A.A. as a whole.

Each group decides what works best for its members within the guidelines and principals the Traditions. This allows for different meeting formats and flavors, while still keeping our primary purpose. We try not to do things that affect other groups adversely or present an unfavorable or inaccurate picture of AA.

Practicing Tradition 4 is a balance between freedom and responsibility. I like my freedom, but I have to allow others freedom too. Autonomy gives me room to make mistakes and learn from correcting them. If I insist on "my way or the highway", I disregard this tradition. At the same time, if I don't speak up when I see that something isn't right, I also disregard this tradition.

Since autonomy means my actions are my own choices, then choosing autonomy means giving up safety. Tradition 4 gives us freedom but it implies that there are limits - limits that are determined by humility, principals before personalities, and guidance from a Higher Power.

Fear of Financial Insecurity Will Leave Us

I was sober for almost 2 months when I received a letter from the federal government that I was being indicted for bank fraud. I pleaded guilty and received 5 years probation and restitution. If I had not gotten sober when I did, I am sure that I would have been sent to prison.

I was sober for about two years when I finally had to throw in the towel on my finances. A collector came to tow my car away. I was very distraught and convinced the tow driver to drop me off at my meeting. Talk about going to any lengths. Five months later, I was at an attorney's office filing for bankruptcy. My financial world had become very unmanageable.

AA and the fellowship gave me the tools to handle, resolve, survive and accept these situations and many more. I also formed a relationship with a Higher Power, whom I call God.

I have been through many storms in sobriety and God has seen me through them all. I have gained strength after each one. Just because I am sober does not mean life got easier. But using the 12 steps and all of the tools makes it easier to handle life, to accept the hard times, and to enjoy the good times in ways I never imagined.

Today, thanks to God, AA and the fellowship, I am sober, confident, loyal, trustworthy, loving, serene, grateful - and free from the fear of economic insecurity.
