A conscious contact with a Higher Power is easy for me to overlook, but it has been the light that has guided me through uncertainty and hardship. It was AA that taught me that "this too shall pass". That no matter what I'm going through, I can get better on the other side of it. The point is to get through it without drinking. And everything, everything that I have gone through has added new strengths and fresh insights to my sobriety.

Prayer started as simply asking in the morning for help to stay sober that day, and thanking God at night for keeping me sober that day. As time went on, my prayer life evolved into deliberate and multi-faceted talks and thoughts throughout the day. I find many prayers in the Big Book - prayers for fear, humility, anger, joy, even sex. I also learn beautiful prayers from other sources. I pray through letters and notes that end up in my journal or my God Box, prayers that lift with the smoke that dissipates from the candle I just blew out, prayers that leave my heart as I hold a sponsee's hand, even prayers that I express as I sit at my desk at work.

Prayer helps me see that my life is an expression of the inspiration of God. Everything that I encounter builds me up and builds my faith in our way of life. It expands my acceptance of people and life's events. It deepens my love for people, for God and for myself. Since it is logical that I would spend the most time with the One who loves me the most, it's easy today to pray often and pray for everything. Anon

From The Archives

The Archives has a “Newspaper and Magazine” notebook that contains many articles about alcoholism and AA from various sources. A lot of these articles have been found in the material contributed by the family of deceased members. Others are brought to the attention of the Archives committee and we find the publication, copy and save them.

Recently, references to an article in *Wired*, “Secret of AA: After 75 Years We Don’t Know How It Works” by Brendan Keorner have been making the rounds among local members on the internet. This article is now in the “Newspaper and Magazine Articles” notebook kept in the Archives room at the Intergroup office as well as the comment which appeared shortly after in the News Journal Opinion section by David Brooks.

The copies of articles in the notebook start in September 30, 1939 with “Alcoholics and God” by Morris Markey which appeared in Liberty Magazine. We also have a copy of the series of seven articles on AA which appeared in the Cleveland Plain Dealer during Oct and Nov 1939.

Most articles early in the collection are copies of newspaper articles. There are at least 15 articles which appeared in newspapers in 1965, the year of the International Convention in Toronto. Some are magazine articles like “A Struggle Within AA” from the May 7, 2007 issue of Newsweek. Included recently are internet articles such as the “An Alcoholic’s Savior: God, Belladonna or Both” from the New York Times-Science Section April 20, 2010 and “Did Alcohol Cause Civilization” from Eastman’s Online Genealogy Newsletter, Dec 29, 2010, a recap of the article from Spiegel Online International, Dec 24, 2009, “Brewing up a Civilization” by Frank Thadesuz.

Next time the notebooks are on display, check it out. These also can be seen at the Intergroup office in the Archives room.

All your group has to do is elect a member who is willing and able to attend meetings and serve their group's interests. To elect an IGR (Intergroup Representative):

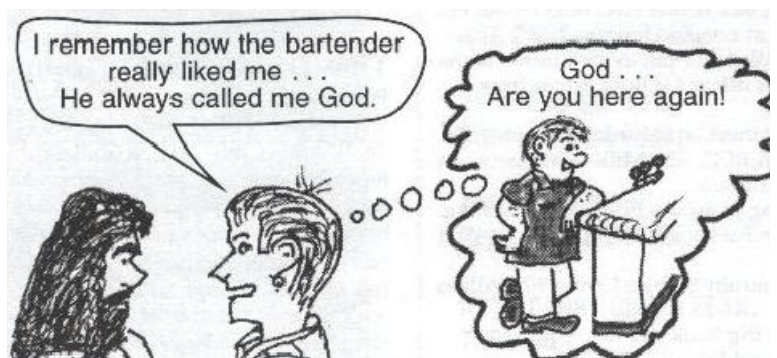
- Secretary calls a business meeting
