### **Welcome Home!**

"Tis the Season to be Lonely" was a comment I heard in a meeting recently. I was listening to fellow alcoholics talk about how the holidays are excruciatingly painful. The range of reasons for the pain was wide. From the simple humiliation of the relative who joyfully remembers the last family gathering where we were the star of the show all the way to those who have nowhere to go. For me it is more just being uncomfortable with people I just don't relate to in my life. I know we share the same blood line, we have a connection somewhere, I just can't seem to find the connection.

When I walked into the rooms of Alcoholics Anonymous I was told "Welcome Home", and I felt it. I felt the warmth and understanding I needed (don't assume this means I was coddled, I was given what I needed). By listening to the people in there I knew we shared a common bond, none I had ever felt before. I don't have to know your drunk-a-log to know you understand me, all I have to know is you are a fellow alcoholic. We share a common disease that attacks us like no other disease does. It attacks us physically, mentally and spiritually. We also share the common solution, a 12 Step Recovery Program. Through going to meetings I am reminded I am not alone and of our common bond, the problem and the solution. I am no longer fighting this disease alone or with people who don't understand, I am in a society of men and women who share the good, the bad and the ugly with each other.

Today for me to be lonely is a choice. Like a lot of things in my life today, I have choices (while drinking the only choice I had was to drink, there were no other options). I can chose to isolate or join in this wonderful fellowship and become of part of something, I have never felt apart of anything until I came to AA. By going to meetings not only do I learn how to work the Steps and live this program, I meet fellow alcoholics, I become involved in service work, I remove myself from the outside of the life boat where I can fall into oblivion anytime. AA is a way of life that has given me a life and a family, no matter where I go.
