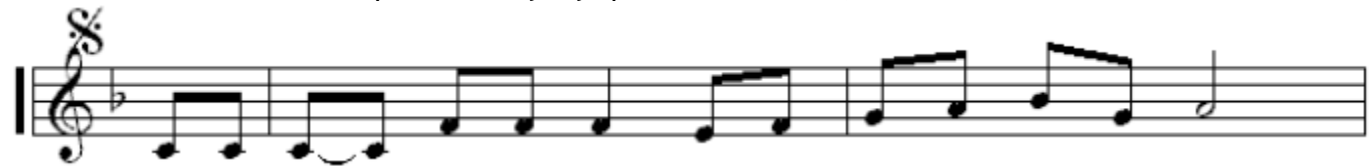

## From The Archives

*AA history is full of people who you may never hear about but who made a difference in someone's life. This story is about Paul Martin, 87 years old and 62 years sober, who passed away this past November. Paul's sponsor was Tom Powers who helped Bill Wilson edit and publish the 12x12. The following was written by Gary B. a long time sober friend of Paul's.*

I met Paul 36 years ago when he spoke at the Wyatt's meeting in Denver. He had been invited to speak there by a fellow known as Big Frank McKibbon. Frank was big and tough and a true Big Book Step Nazi who said that I should come hear Paul. I was surprised that Frank really looked up to anyone so I figured I better go. I left the meeting knowing that I had just met a man who really believed that the 12 Step program of AA was indeed "sufficient" for alcoholics and anyone else who might be motivated to go to the lengths we need.

24 years ago I called Paul with my ass hanging out and jam on my face and asked him for help. I had not drank, but I was living a life of infidelity, dishonesty in all my affairs--my wife still says I was depressed during that time.

Paul spent his last three months in a retirement facility. I am told that this past August there was a young man who was touring the home with his parents who were thinking of moving there. The tour guide, who always spoke to each resident as they passed by, would say "Hi Joe" or "Hi Mary" etc., but whenever they passed Paul she said "Hi Paul Martin." The group passed by and the young man returned and asked Paul if he was the guy who knew Bill Wilson. Paul said he was and asked what he could do for the young man. The kid said he was three years sober and was having trouble getting along with his parents. Paul said "Do you have your amends list in your pocket?"

Paul then showed the kid how to write an inventory, told him to come back when he had it completed (Paul gave him one week). The kid came back, took the 5th Step with Paul and a few of Paul's friends. On September 10th the kid returned to see Paul and said he had made all the amends with his parents and things were getting better.

## **Experience, Strength, and Hope**

### **HOLIDAY SURVIVAL KIT**

In camping wisdom, the survival kit has to stay on your body in case you lose your pack or get separated from all your regular stuff. In camping, it's not unheard of to get lost or get hurt. So it is with many recovered alcoholics who want to survive the holidays. It's not unheard of for us to get lost in the chaos or even (heaven forbid!!!) forget our primary purpose. Many a would-be camper only survived because they had a survival kit. Many a recovered alcoholic (especially in the early years) stays sober because they actually have *and use* their holiday survival kit.

By the way, by "Holidays" I mean surviving the period between Thanksgiving and New Year's..... if you're looking for help with St. Patrick's Day or Easter.....you're on your own!!!!

Here is a list of what I have in my holiday survival kit:

#### **MEETINGS (Campers: Water)**

Whether in town or out of town, I always plan a meeting. When all else fails, I also have a list of online meetings.

#### **PHONE NUMBERS and EMAIL ADDRESSES (Campers: Duct Tape):**

I also make sure to keep the information written on a piece of paper in case something happens to my cell phone or computer (cyber cafes are lifesavers).

#### **BIG BOOK (Campers: Bright-Colored Emergency Blanket):**

Just like an emergency blanket can provide instant shelter, warmth, and can be spotted from aircraft, so can a Big Book provide instant mental readjustment. Here – try this one on for size: "There had been no fight. Where had been my high resolve? I simply didn't know. It hadn't even come to mind. Someone had pushed a drink my way, and I had taken it. Was I crazy? I began to wonder, for such an appalling lack of perspective seemed near being just that." (Bill's Story, page 5).

#### **PRAYER & MEDITATION (Camper: Candle Stub & Matches):**

You might need to start a fire to keep warm. So it is with prayer and meditation. It calms me down and clears my head. When I also use my daily readers, I am much kinder, calmer, and sober.

#### **SLOGANS (Campers: Band-Aids):**

Just like a camper has many, a wise alcoholic always has one or two (or three or four...). A personal favorite for holidays is... (you guessed it!)...*this too shall pass!!!*

#### **ATTITUDE (Campers: Small Jackknife):**

If you've ever seen a swiss army knife, I don't need to say more. Attitude can be everything. If you "complicate a one-car funeral", "screw up a free lunch", "build a mountain out of a grain of sand" and "pole vault over a mouse turd".....see what happens to your holiday!!!

Of course the most important aspect of any survival kit is making sure you use it! Campers usually don't hesitate to whip out the duct tape, but many alcoholics hesitate to make that phone call. So, just like camping provides freedom to enjoy the great outdoors, holidays also provide recovered alcoholics with the freedom to enjoy being with friends, loved ones, or simply being happy celebrating alone. Holidays can actually bring a lot of joy and growth – the key is to minimize the drama and maximize the fun! So, plan ahead, make sure your spiritual tool kit is stocked and in working order and most important ---don't forget your survival kit!
