### A Relationship of Grace

#### **What it used to be like:**

Relationships were like wars. I always felt like I was getting prepared for battle. The battle of "winning" someone over, the battle of pretending to be someone I wasn't. There was a lot of fear - fear that they wouldn't love me if they saw the real me, fear that my expectations of how the relationship should be would not happen. Often there was the basic "drop-down drag out" or just the typical "I'm going to treat you to the 'violence of silence' even if you don't really know what you did to p\*\* me off" battle. In a nutshell, a lot of stress seemed well worth a drink (IMHO).

#### **What happened:**

One day, I received the grace of an emotional bottom.... in sobriety. This time I could see my patterns and I knew two things. First, I couldn't do relationships the way I was used to and hope to stay sober. Second, my capacity for chaos and "trauma drama" had become pretty low in sobriety, so break-ups and arguments were not conducive to contented sobriety.

#### **What it's like now:**

I took a five-year hiatus just hanging out with my AA pals and learning how to be a happy useful member of our fellowship, Then one day, my Higher Power said, "You have some rough edges so I'm giving you a relationship; that should do the trick."

In this relationship, I'm learning to extend grace, the unmerited favor. Grace is healing and restorative and makes us better friends. Neither of us are perfect, but grace allows us to have a great relationship anyway. Learning to extend grace means we neither ignore faults nor demand change. We're not stuck on brokenness and humanness, but believe in the best of who we are. When we extend grace to each other, our relationship grows. I don't believe either of us could be together if we didn't treat each other as though we believe that we can succeed and grow, separately .....and together. Anon

*A Very Brief Alphabet of AA History*

**Abby G.** - Cleveland A.A., lawyer, 1st A.A. meeting in Cleveland met in his home May 18 1939 16 members  
**Bill C.** - young Canadian alcoholic, former attorney, compulsive gambler, stayed Bill W's house nearly year, committed suicide Oct 1936 using gas stove; before he died, he sold Bill W's clothes  
**Clarence S.** - early Cleveland A.A., led revolt & announced special meeting of alcoholics separate from Oxford Group; leader of group of dissident anti Conference & anti General Service Office, his story "Home Brewmeister" is in 3 editions of Big Book  
**Don V.** - had mortgage business, asked Bill to investigate 2 companies, Bill's last job before giving A.A. his full-time self, offered to finance Stepping Stones  
**Edna McD.** - wife early Cleveland A.A., county visiting nurse, helped get beds for alcoholics at Cleveland's Deaconess Hospital  
**Four Horsemen** - plagues of alcoholics  
**George F.** - Norwegian immigrant, started A.A. in Oslo Norway  
**Hyde, Mr.** - Dr. Jekyll - Mr. Hyde analogy  
**'Ig'** - Dr. Bob's nickname Sister Ignatia  
**Janet G.** - she & Bill W, edited A.A. Way Life, that later became As Bill Sees It  
**Kaiser, Dr.** - doctor at Toledo state asylum, let Chet M. sign out patients take to Toledo A.A. meetings  
**Leo F.** - Los Angeles A.A. Group, instrumental in bringing A.A. to San Quentin  
**Main, Florence** - Oxford Group leader in Akron  
**Niebuhr, Reinhold** - One of possible authors of *Serenity Prayer*  
**Oscar V.** - from old St. Louis family, stayed Bill's house  
**Paul O., Dr** - his story "Doctor, Alcoholic, Addict" (3<sup>rd</sup> edition) and "Acceptance Was The Answer" (4<sup>th</sup> edition)  
**Quaw, Clayton** - Quaw & Foley, firm for which Bill did stock market investigations  
**Ricardo** - inmate San Quentin, also helpful in bringing A.A. to San Quentin  
**Shep C.** - Vermont; did considerable drinking with Ebby T.  
**Ty M.** - Milwaukee A.A. came to Akron to get help from Dr. Bob  
**Underwood, Ivan** - former Trustee  
**Val D.** - founder A.A. South Africa 1946, sobered up reading the Big Book  
**Weaver, Marion** - non A.A. office worker in mid 1940's, typed the Traditions  
**Mr. X.** - what Dr. Harry Tiebout called "Bill W" in papers when quoting him  
**Yvonne N.** - edited Volusia County (Florida) Intergroup newsletter, "High 'n Dry"  
**Zerelda** - spent a night with the Wilson's
