AA History Daytona Beach Archives

Originally printed in the High or Dry, September 1981

“Daytona Beach in District 8 has been selected along with Jacksonville and Orlando, to be an archival center for A.A. A few good people are needed to help the local Archives Committee build an Archives Department for the Daytona Beach Center for A.A. Archives. The Steering Committee has lent its moral and financial support as well as designating a room for work and storage at the Intergroup Office.

That “funny” word, ARCHIVES (ar’Kivz), comes originally from the Greek *archeion*, “town hall” and *arche*, “the beginning, government” and today indicates “a place where public records, documents, etc. are kept” (**New World Dictionary**). Alcoholics Anonymous has a fascinating and tremendously voluminous history, especially in oral tradition, much of which remains unfathomed and unrecorded at present. Imagine sitting at a kitchen table over steaming mugs of coffee and listening to an old-timer of thirty-five plus years sobriety share memories of his or her first meetings, the prior drunkenness, loneliness, and despair, and telling and showing you the way it is today, sober. Then someone remembers the tape has nearly run out. This in-depth, one-on-one sharing touches each individual involved. Properly taped, edited, and transcribed, this bit of history can become a vibrant segment of A.A.’s tradition as it continues to reach out across the earth to suffering and sober alcoholics.

Then there is the sharing involved in getting the written history of every group in our district. Ever hear of Wally and Little Bill at “The Ranch” with its Saturday night barbeque and speakers’ meetings?

And that’s just for starters. We need your ideas, your experience, your time and involvement. But beyond that, we need people who have vision. It is a worthy undertaking and a very necessary one for A.A. to continue to grow and to flourish, always gratefully remembering where it came from.

Don’t procrastinate. Do it NOW! Let’s have a real Archives Department by the end of 1981!”

The AA Tradition

The Sixth Tradition

An AA group ought never endorse, finance or lend the AA name to any related facility or outside enterprise, lest problems of money, property, and prestige divert us from our primary purpose.

This Tradition is one that I recently violated by adding non-AA events to the calendar. So, the timing of the 6th Tradition is perfect. This tradition reminds me to stick to AA principles while focusing on my own sobriety in order to preserve AA’s integrity while protecting my own identity. We must guard against allowing outside things to sidetrack us from our real purpose. What I do or have is not related to who I am. I have little control over what other people think. Lastly, in AA the only label that matters is “Alcoholic”.

(The first word of the First Step)

When I was drinking all I could ever think about was “I, I, I,” or “Me, Me, Me.” Such painful obsession of self, such soul sickness, such spiritual selfishness bound me to the bottle for more than half my life.

The journey to find God and to do His will one day at a time began with the first word of the First Step ... “We.” There was power in numbers, there was strength in numbers, there was safety in numbers, and for an alcoholic like me, there was life in numbers. If I had tried to recover alone I probably would have died. With God and another alcoholic I have a divine purpose in my life.
