That's why Step 10 is so powerful...it reminds me that I can't rest on my laurels or focus on doing everyone else's inventory. Let's face it - isn't that called the easier softer way? It's easy to stay home watching TV when I'm tired instead of going to a meeting. It's easy to sit in a meeting and complain about how people are doing things wrong...why can't they do it like I remember back when I was a newcomer? Why? Why? Why? Let's face it - isn't that called a "dry drunk"?

So, I need to hone my skills of self observation and self-reflection, because that ensures self-preservation. Step 10 helps me maintain these skills on a daily basis. An earlier step taught me to "put aside what others have done" and instead look at myself and get to the truth of the part that I played. In a simpler language, my sponsor said, "If you have a finger pointing at someone, you have three fingers pointing back at you!" Yuck! I hate when he does that!!!

Over the years, members have shared how they make the 10th Step a working part of their lives. I've heard things like "getting current", "daily inventory" and "spotcheck". The Big Book tells me to "continue to watch for selfishness, dishonesty, resentment and fear" - that "when these crop up, we ask God at once to remove them".

So, fling open your windows, take the mattresses outside, get a brush and work on the knooks and crannies. It's spring. Time for some major spring cleaning.

When I was sober eight months I had an argument with one of my sponsors and he said, "Find another sponsor". I went to a daytime meeting and met a 75 year old man who was sober 32 years. He was a widower with no children. I knew he needed someone to drive him to meetings, mow his lawn and help him do things. Over the next ten plus years, I drove the car and he took me to meetings. Here are some of the lessons I learned from him:

- It's great to be in AA.
- It's positive thinking.
- We have to face reality.
- ♣ Bend our knees before our elbows.
- Easy does it but do it.
- Keep coming back and stay in.
- ♣ You're going to get out of this program what you put into it.
- It's faith, hope and confidence.
- Keep trying until your dying day.

I was with him when he died on March 27th, 1986. He was 85 years old with more than 43 years of sobriety.

Soil Preparation

We've had some major freezes this winter....makes me wonder why I donated my old winter coat to charity! Well, it's too late to relocate back north so I might as well dream about what I'm going to do when it starts getting warm again. Lots of projects come to mind...that bathroom remodel that is still not done, the get together with some special people that I still haven't planned.....but truly the project that has me most excited is outdoors with my plants. They took a beating this winter and I didn't cut off the dead stuff because I didn't want new growth that might get frozen with yet another freeze. Freeze, freeze! But even before I resurrect the plants, I have to realize that no matter what I do on the surface, it won't mean a hoot if I don't work in the soil first. If I want lush, happy plants starting in the Spring, then I better consider some soil preparation. Let's think about this another way...because for me the earth often gives me analogies that I can use for myself. All I have to do is pay attention to the Spirit of the Universe. I read a meditation once that said that my job is to prepare the soil and my Creator Spirit's job is to plant the seeds.
