The Gratitude Paradox

"Though I still find it difficult to accept today's pain and anxiety with any great degree of serenity—as those more advanced in the spiritual life seem able to do—I can give thanks for present pain nevertheless. I find the willingness to do this by contemplating the lessons learned from past suffering—lessons which have led to the blessings I now enjoy. I can remember how the agonies of alcoholism, the pain of rebellion and thwarted pride, have often led me to God's grace, and so to a new freedom." As Bill Sees It, pg 266

At an anniversary meeting someone once said that only in AA could a person celebrate the worst day in their life with a medallion, a cake, and a lot of cheers and applause. Indeed it's true. Only in AA has our worst become our best.

The Gift of Desperation

How can we feel grateful when life has dealt us a terrible blow and we find ourselves (voluntarily or involuntarily) in an AA meeting? Don't leave until the miracle happens. The miracle can be different things to many people. The miracle is suddenly feeling overwhelming gratitude for the, "pitiful and incomprehensible demoralization", that brought the bottom of all bottoms. Often the miracle is the swift answer to the foxhole prayer, "God, please help me!" The miracle is when you still go to meetings when you no longer need to get your paper signed. The miracle happens when you get excited because you have coffee duty this month or you will be chairing the meeting tonight. The miracle happens when you're thrilled when the newcomer comes back the following week, when they admit, ".....and I am an alcoholic" for the first time, and when they finally share their story. The miracle is the change in personality that brings about recovery from alcoholism.

An Attitude of Gratitude

We know what gratitude *sounds* like, but what does gratitude *look* like? November seems to be the month when "Gratitude" is a topic at many meetings. We even have "Gratitude" banquets. "Don't tell me how grateful you are – show me!!!" Gratitude looks like longtime members who still attend meetings regularly. Gratitude drives people to meetings and looks forward to coffee duty. Gratitude relies on a living breathing sponsor for guidance and accountability. Gratitude takes meetings to jails and institutions. Gratitude reads the Big Book and other AA literature, and keeps in contact with other alcoholics all the time. Gratitude checks in with the newcomer to see how they're doing. Gratitude attends Intergroup, District, or Area meetings as a participant or as a visitor. Gratitude sets up or cleans up at a meeting. Gratitude buys a Big Book for the scared and confused newcomer. Gratitude sponsors people and carries the message. Gratitude puts money in the basket.

"Such is the paradox of AA regeneration: strength arising out of complete defeat and weakness, the loss of one's old life as a condition for finding a new one. But we of AA do not have to understand this paradox; we have only to be grateful for it." Alcoholics Anonymous Comes of Age, p. 46

From The Archives

We recently received two requests for copies of "The Seven Things to Do." This is a talk given by Rich W. at the first meeting of the Southside Group in Quincy, Massachusetts. The subject of the talk is, "a brief outline of the AA programme", and is dated August 27, 1943. There are two different copies of the notes for this talk in our archives.

The first copy states in the introduction that he has been sober for three months and these were the things he had to do to, "get away from alcohol."

"Seven things- Admit I am an alcoholic - Realize I must spend the rest of my life without liquor – Be absolutely honest about myself – Turn to a Higher Power for help – live one day at a time – come to meetings regularly – work with other alcoholics."

The second copy is labeled (NEW) and undated, is titled "The seven points of Alcoholics Anonymous. 1. Admission, 2. Fellowship, 3. Surrender, 4. Inventory, 5. Restitution, 6. Live Today, 7. Service

Below on the same page is another list titled "Seven Things About AA" and is just a little different from the list above.

1. Acceptance, 2. Fellowship. 3. Force for Good, 4. Inventory, 5. Restitution, 6. Live today, 7. Service.

This last list contains the thoughts connected to the items listed. For instance, Service is described as, "Carry the message – Results in hands of God – Challenge – Feeling of usefulness – Life worth while."

Good thoughts for all of us to keep in mind.
