A few years after coming into AA I learned this valuable lesson. Due to chronic illness I was no longer able to work and was able to convince myself that I just wasn't up to making as many meetings as I was used to.

I thought that a couple of years in AA were enough to keep me at the level of sobriety that I enjoyed at that time...and I was wrong. What started to happen was an escalating slide toward that black pit of alcoholism. The most horrible character defects started to creep in and I began treating people with real nastiness. I was having a hard time understanding why I was being left alone. Of course, I was feeling like it was everyone else's problems. It couldn't possibly be anything I was doing! I was sober for goodness sake...didn't people see that??

Somewhere in that period of time, I remembered reading the above quote. I finally became aware that my thinking wasn't any better than it had ever been, and if I wanted to remain a sober and sane human being I would have to make some hard choices. I began asking for rides to meetings when I didn't feel able to drive myself, I began calling people, I began reaching out for help from others who had what I wanted.

FROM THE ARCHIVES

In March, the New Smyrna Beach Group presented the *Back to Basics* program in which participants take the Twelve Steps in four weeks using the Big Book as outlined by Wally P. in his book *Back to Basics*.

Week #1. Overview and Step 1

Week #2. Steps 2, 3 and overview of 4 and 5

Week #3. Steps 5, 6, 7, 8 and 9

Week #4. Steps 10, 11 and 12 with emphasis on How to listen to God.

This is the way that the early members in Akron took newcomers through the Steps. They claimed to have had a 75% success rate. New members had to attend this 12 Steps course before they were admitted to the regular meetings. It is said that Dr. Bob would take a couple of people a day through the steps using this format. Thirty years ago when Clarence P. lived in Central Florida he used this format to take people through the steps. He was one of the original members in Akron and the subject of the Brewmeister story in the Big Book.

In the Richmond Walker papers that we have in the archives there is a detailed outline for the "Monday Instruction Course." In 4 weeks the topics to be covered are similar to a beginners introduction to AA.

Week #1. What is an Alcoholic, What is AA and why it works.

Week #2. Changing our way of thinking

Week #3. Spiritual basis-putting AA to work in our lives

Week #4. Enjoying the benefits of AA and passing AA on to others.

When Eddie R. came to New Smyrna in the early 1980's, he started a Beginners meeting. It was set up according to the guidelines provided by GSO. One member leads for a period of 6 weeks and then it rotates to another member.

Week #1. How to stay away from one drink, one day at a time.

Week #2. Alcoholism, the disease

Week #3. How It works-12 suggested steps for recovery

Week #4. Twelve Traditions-what we learned from AA's mistakes

Week #5. AA in print-service to others

Week #6. Other factors in AA Recovery

The Monday Instruction Course by Rich Walker and the GSO guidelines for Beginners meetings are available in the Archives collection at Intergroup.

If I am sober, then I should act sober. I may be the only copy of a Big Book that someone might see.

To borrow on the saying "Friends should not let friends drive drunk", I say "Friends should tell friends when their sobriety is showing".

We cannot become so uncaring of those around us that we lose sight of our primary purpose, to help other alcoholics find sobriety.

Another thing it guards against is competition among groups who believe theirs is the only way that AA should be done. From the diversity of groups around us we know that variety is a good thing. There is something for everyone and we are all privileged to enjoy as many types of meetings as we wish on any given week. This helps us all become familiar with the workings of AA in early sobriety.

Office Coordinator Report by Mike D: There were a total of 142 calls and 203 visits to Intergroup in Feb. 2012. There were 7 help calls recorded.
