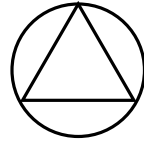

## THE THREE LEGACIES - RECOVERY, UNITY, SERVICE

As I ponder – I am a good ponderer – the bold word “maximum,” I cannot help but think, “What does that mean?” In the beginning, I couldn’t sit still, so I moved cookies around on trays and tidied up things. Although my own home was unkempt with dishes packed in the sink basin, I vacuumed, mopped and wiped up and down all the surfaces in the meeting hall almost every night. I didn’t really know what else to do, however, I knew what not to do.

Time passed and I stayed busy doing, and stayed sober. Then one night, two members “voted” that I should be given a key to the meeting hall. I remember one saying, “OK, turn off the lights, but leave this one on. Lock all the windows, turn off the fans, dump the coffee, vacuum, mop, push in all the chairs, leave the blinds up so the police can see inside because we’ve had some people break in. Oh, and don’t forget to lock up, kid.”

I remember thinking, “What is this madness? I’m only six months sober! Surely there’s someone better suited for this.” But I did as I was instructed, and usually forgot something. I worked full time and could drive by then, and I tried very hard to make sure I was there, even just to close up and clean for the next day – one day at a time.

Within the next six months, I was chairing a Friday meeting, trying to be the Secretary for the group and helping tally the bills for rent. As my homegroup grew, so did I. God provided sponsorship and I worked the 12 Steps. I made cakes and tried to cook for my homegroup. I started to sponsor others. I was invited to the detox center to share on Monday nights. Whatever was asked of me never seemed like a chore; I was honored and felt a greater purpose was the goal.

### **FROM THE ARCHIVES**

In the Archives reports, we report that we are converting audiotapes to CDs and storing files in the cloud. This is part of our preservation effort to keep up with suggestions for modern media storage. The extent of the tape collection in the archives room as well as the lending library at Intergroup is fairly large. All these tapes are primarily donations from members.

The Intergroup lending library has 544 tapes. These include books on tape such as *AA Comes of Age*, speaker tapes by Clancy I. on specific topics including his story, Sandy B. on the Twelve Steps and Traditions recorded at a roundup at Daytona Beach, and Father Martin on Relapse and Family. There are also AA pamphlets on tape – *A Brief Guide to AA*, *A Newcomer Asks and This is AA*; tapes by early members – Bill and Lois, Dr. Bob's last talk and Marty Mann telling her story. There are many speaker tapes from round-ups and conventions from all over the country as well as tapes of local speakers recorded at the Almous Club.

The Archives does not have near the number tapes as the Intergroup collection and there are duplicates of some of the Intergroup tapes. But we have tape sets such as "A Twelve Step Study" by Ray M. "Journey Through the Steps" by Ray O'K. of Miami, "History and Traditions" by James M. of Sidel, Louisiana, and a set of Joe and Charlie tapes which have been also converted to CD's. There are several sets of various Spring and Fall round-ups in Daytona Beach. We have a complete set of the *Golden Books* on tape. Our early founders' tapes include Bill W. – The Day Dr. Bob Died, How the Big Book was Put Together and 14<sup>th</sup> International Convention in Ft. Worth, Texas.

Our short-term goal is to convert tapes of local interest first. We have speaker tapes of members who have passed on - Hal M., John G., Bill A., Lamar B., Duke D. and others. Also in the collection are all of the Oldtimer interviews we have done so far, the 2001 Longtimers meeting in Sanford and the first Oldtimers meeting in Daytona Beach.

The Intergroup tapes are available for loan if you still have a tape player. There is a tape player available at Intergroup if you do not own a tape player and wish to listen to a particular tape at the Intergroup office. Archive tapes are not for loan but can be listened to at the office.

As God moved me from position to position, I bent and shaped to conform to His will. I don't think I could comprehend it any other way! As I learn to fit myself to be of maximum service to God and others, I have no choice but to change in the process. Who I thought I was, and what I thought I needed has dissolved. What remains is a very basic and quiet knowledge of the truth about me. I am, at the core, selfish and self-centered. I am alcoholic. Somehow I started living the steps!

I will remain of service, with God's grace, as long as I am needed. I recall what Dr. Bob said to Bill W. on their last visit before Dr. Bob's passing. He said to Bill, "You still have a lot of work to do." His most powerful statement came next, "Keep this simple." My mind tends to think "maximum" means something like fireworks and excitement. However, I've come to realize it's more like the "greatest need" of a situation. How wonderful and powerful to find all I need to do is all I can do. No more and no less. It's about that time that I get to experience true humility – and I'm still usually the last to know!

How grateful I am to serve. How simple the formula! I cannot gush long enough about the wonderful friends, deeper knowledge of God, and basis for recovery that service has provided. I will simply say – Thank you, for the opportunity to serve.

***The A.A. Tradition***

Tradition Four

**With respect to its own affairs, each A.A. group should be responsible to no other authority than its own conscience. But when its plans concern the welfare of neighboring groups also, those groups ought to be consulted. And no group, regional committee, or individual should ever take any action that might greatly affect A.A. as a whole without conferring with the trustees of the General Service Board. On such issues our common welfare is paramount.**

With respect to its own affairs, the group may make any decisions, adopt any attitudes that it likes. No overall or intergroup authority should challenge this primary privilege. We feel this out to be so, even though the group might sometimes act with complete indifference to our Tradition. For example, an AA group could, if it wished, hire a paid preacher and support him out of the proceeds of a group nightclub. Though such an absurd procedure would be miles outside our Tradition, the group's "right to be wrong" would be held inviolate. We are sure that each group can be granted, and safely granted, these most extreme privileges. We know that our familiar process of trial and error would summarily eliminate both the preacher and the nightclub. Those severe growing pains which invariably follow any radical departure from AA Tradition can be absolutely relied upon to bring an erring group back into line. An AA group need not be coerced by any human government over and above its own members. Their own experience, plus AA opinion in surrounding groups, plus God's prompting in their group conscience would be sufficient. Much travail has already taught us this. Hence we may confidently say to each group. "You should be responsible to no other authority than your own conscience."
