My feelings become easily hurt when I am trying to run my life my way and I finally realize that it's because my way just doesn't work!

On p. 86 the Big Book reminds me that in the morning *"...we ask God to direct our thinking, especially asking that it be divorced from self-pity, dishonest or self-seeking motives."* These were the very things that filled my life and made it so very difficult to cope with everyday situations and people.

I am so very grateful for the Big Book of Alcoholics Anonymous that teaches me each and every day that I am not running this show called my life. Reading the 10th and 11th Step every morning keeps me in God's will not mine. When I do this faithfully I find that everything in my life works exactly right...it may be far from what I think it should be but I am aware that my thinking is what got me into the mess my life was before recovery.

"As we go through the day we pause, when agitated or doubtful, and ask for the right thought or action." Big Book p. 87

Living this program is such a simple thing when I take the time needed to keep in fit spiritual condition. Resting on my laurels has never worked in the past and today I am not willing to try it again. Learning from past mistakes is something I am finally able to do. Amazing concept!

FROM THE ARCHIVES

The purpose of the Archives and duties of the Archivist are to solicit, store, organize, share and preserve historical material and information related to the fellowship of Alcoholics Anonymous especially from the local area.

We continue to solicit group histories and group records from the local area. Group histories are indexed alphabetically and stored in a notebook in the Archives room at the Intergroup Office. This notebook is brought to the various functions and is part of the Archives display. Group records are in a file drawer arranged alphabetically by group name and the contents are listed in the Archives room inventory.

We interview members in the area who have long term sobriety and have been in the area long enough to remember what it was like 20, 30 years ago or longer. These interviews are transcribed and put into a notebook.

In the collection is a First Edition Big Book, A Second Edition Big book which is signed by Bill W. and a medical book from 1835 with a description of drunkenness and the cure from that era as well as a few very old Grapevines. These are stored in a special water resistant acid free archival box. They are only displayed in a specially sealed box which has a clear Plexiglas cover.

To safeguard some of our historical items we have a special collection of duplicates of Daytona Beach AA History, early newspaper and magazine articles, early issues of the Hi 'n Dry, early Meeting Schedules and flyers for social activities such as picnics, dances, workshops and other AA related functions. The duplicates are part of the Archives exhibit for events away from the Intergroup Office.

Our preservation efforts are now targeting the Richmond Walker papers. All original papers were sprayed with a de-acidifying chemical, placed in archival safe sleeves and stored in special acid free boxes several years ago. Now, copies of all his AA talks and a collection of paragraphs which are his thoughts on various topics relating to staying sober and sobriety have been digitalized into a PDF file and are stored on the Intergroup computer as well as a DVD and a computer which uses remote storage on the internet.

The first paragraph of this article describes the work of the archivist published in the Archives Workbook by GSO. We are doing our best to follow these directives in our Archives.

Experience, Strength, and Hope **AA in Egypt-part 3**

I saw a few young Egyptian men shaking hands out front. I walked up and said, "does anyone here speak English?" They all nodded, smiled, and said yes! Then I said, "Are you guys friends of Bill Wilson?" Even bigger smiles - outstretched hands, and the genuine warmth that we always find among members of this fellowship. I was home!!

Inside, I met a colleague. In a city of 20 million people, I ran into one of the 4 or 5 dozen employees of the school where I work. God, I love "coincidences" - don't you?

We opened with a moment of silence, read the Preamble, How it Works, the Traditions, and the Promises. The topic of step 3 was brought up - how do we turn our will & lives over to the care of God as we understand Him? Several people shared, including yours truly. It was all in English - though of course most of the people who spoke had thick accents. But the words and the feelings were the same as I've ever heard. It was a very good meeting. Right about the time the second person began to share, I felt that wonderful feeling of being home again, of being among people who are just like me, of being among people who understand, who are able to help me get through the stress and challenges that I face here. And I realized at that moment that, although I had experienced friendship and warmth and the eagerness to help from just about everyone I had met so far here in Egypt, this feeling was something special, and something that is not available anywhere else but at a meeting. I knew that I was not alone.

I wasn't sure if I wanted to go out today. I have a lot of work to do this weekend for school (weekends here are Friday and Saturday - the work week runs Sunday through Thursday). I am still somewhat apprehensive about venturing out alone in this huge city, and I had never gone very far - just a mile or two away. Mostly I've been walking around, familiarizing myself with the neighborhood. I feel very safe and comfortable here in my cocoon. "Show an alcoholic a rut and he'll furnish it & move in." Yes, that was where I was. I had been in Egypt for less than a month - in this apartment for less than two weeks - and I was already happily settled into my rut. But my instincts told me to get off my ass and go to a meeting. I had no idea I would run into a colleague. I had no idea I would immediately meet several new friends - but when I sat down at that table and heard the preamble, I knew that God had spoken clearly through my "instincts" - or more accurately, all the good things I have heard through the years from so many good people in the rooms. Some of that evidently sunk in.

That was an amazing concept to me then and still fills me with gratitude to God for giving us this amazing program and the people who were willing to follow His leading in how it should be run in order to reach the suffering alcoholic.
