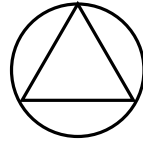

The longer I continue to practice this program, use the tools that AA teaches me and remember that "Love and tolerance is our code." (p. 84) the better my life is. Growth has to continue every day....I have to be willing and able to see the miracles all around me as I "...trudge the Road of Happy Destiny" (p164). Without vigilance my life will slip back into old, sick behavior and I love this life too much to let that happen.

I am suggesting that We, AA members of Volusia County, form a PI/CPC volunteer group that meets at District 32's monthly meeting to service all the aspects and needs of Public Information and Cooperation with Professional Community. This role and need has become far too large for one individual to adequately provide and navigate. We are reaching the still suffering but through your help with our Higher Power and service to our fellow man we can achieve together what I can not do alone.

What is PI/CPC? PI provides A.A. members to speak to non-A.A. organizations and groups. Their purpose is primarily to explain what A.A. is, and what A.A. is not. They are volunteer local A.A. members, but are not official spokespersons for A.A. This service is referred to as "Public Information and Cooperation with Professional Communities" or PI/CPC. The purpose of P.I. service work is to provide accurate A.A. information to the public when requested. P.I. volunteers visit schools, businesses and community meetings for this purpose. They also serve as resources for our friends in the local media, emphasizing our Traditions of anonymity, singleness of purpose and non-affiliation, as well as offering A.A. public service announcements to radio and television stations.

Surrender-"to yield to the power of another". Wow little did I know when I got sober 29 years ago that there would be many "surrenders." Surrendering of the alcohol was just the beginning. Over time my life, will, and my thinking (which influences my emotions) I have turned over to a power greater than myself. That power for me is God.

I am so grateful that I get it...on most days. I was told in the beginning "you have to surrender to win". Needless to say, I was very skeptical. My sponsor introduced me to the steps and traditions and later on to the Concepts. I did not drink -no matter what- went to meetings, followed instructions (most of the time). I began to grasp the freedom and peace that sobriety can give. I must say this is an ongoing process and the road of recovery isn't always straight. For me I have chosen to stay on the road even when it curves and gets very bumpy. Life does show up.

In the beginning I had it all figured out; if I do this, then this will happen. Not quite that simple. More has been and continues to be revealed. Which for me has meant more surrender to God, the program and this ongoing process of recovery. So glad I do not graduate. It is definitely a twenty four hour daily timetable.

Dr. Harry M. Tiebout, MD, a great supporter of early AA and served on the Board of Trustees 1957-1966 said the following:

"The act of surrender and the change that follows are inseparable, since it is safe to assume that if there is no change, there has been no surrender."

THE EIGHTH TRADITION

"Alcoholics Anonymous should remain forever nonprofessional, but our service centers may employ special workers."

Spiritual as it is, AA remains very much of this world. The Eighth Tradition, like the Seventh, focuses on a vulgar five-letter word that isn't actually mentioned in either: money. Many of us have had to explain to some cynical prospect, "No, I'm not a social worker. I don't get paid for talking with you. I'm doing it because it's the best way to stay sober myself."

It became clear to the early members that no AA should ever ask or accept payment for "carrying this message to somebody else, person to person and face to face."

The first intergroups or central offices were usually manned by AA volunteers; now, most such offices are so busy that full-time employees are needed as well.

What if the Fellowship decided that all such assignments should be handled *only* by unpaid volunteers? In present-day AA, there's too great a volume of work to be done in spare hours here and there, and only the rich or the retired could afford to work full-time.
