BEING HUMAN

One of the first rewards of attending AA meetings was hearing others that thought like me. I wasn't alone. Even hearing the thoughts labeled "self-pity" or "pride" couldn't remove the comfort of knowing others felt like I did. That was my first reward. I lost my isolation. It was a strange journey, trying to understand this person I didn't know: Me.

Newcomers often blame the disease of alcoholism for any bad behavior they have. After years in the program I've met ordinary people who have as many fears as I have or heard talked about in the Rooms. The one symptom that makes us alcoholic is that in our fear, we turn to booze and after one, we can't stop. "Fear, the fabric of our lives is shot through with it."

Fear doesn't come from a feeling- it comes from a thought. Like..."If I say what I'm thinking, people will laugh at me." The one who laughs may be afraid everyone will expect them to say what they think. It comes from pride. As a newcomer, I was sure I didn't have any.

The question in my 4th step that showed me I had pride was, "I'm afraid that I'll look stupid or foolish." I immediately said, "Oh yeah, I've got that" ...Oops, pride. Denial again. The more I realize that I'm just an ordinary person, the more comfortable I am in my own skin. The problem comes when I stuff that old thought/feeling and take a drink. It's what I think that makes me drink. What I think creates self-esteem or shame. Take your pick.

That's why we say that if you want to stay sober, do the steps. I have to change my thinking. The bonus is that when I change my thinking, I'm so much happier. I knew a man who was sober 50 years and never did the steps. He was a very unhappy old man.

FROM THE ARCHIVES – WEDNESDAY WOMEN'S GROUP

A new update to the Wednesday Women's Group has been submitted by Sharon R.: The Wednesday Women's group started on the first Tuesday in January of 1975 at the Almous Club on Foote Court at 2:30 pm. Early on it was changed to 2 pm. There is no note as to when the meeting was changed to Wednesday. Founding members were Martha S., Kathy F., Jean G., Virginia G., and Marge F. In addition to the founders, early members were Dorothy S., Greta A., Dorothy R., Mary McC., Peggy K., June D., Theresa Mc C., Audrey H., Carol T., Martha B., Trish A., Alice, Joyce and Sally. The present membership numbers 33.

The meeting moved from Foote Court to Central Baptist Church in 1987. While at Central Baptist, the meeting room has changed three times. The Wednesday meeting is speaker/discussion. A step meeting was added on Friday at 10 am in 2007 or 2008. A Traditions study was recently added on the last Friday of the month in May 2014.

"Our founders have passed on. One early member, Peggy K. celebrated her 41th anniversary in 1992 and asked Hal M. to speak. He is one of very few men who have ever been invited to attend our woman's group.

OFFICE ASSISTANT

JOB Description: Assist the Office Coordinator with the day-to-day operation of Volusia County Intergroup. Candidate will be expected to help with volunteer scheduling, ordering, daily auditing of sales, managing the duties of the Desk Volunteers, and enforcing all policies and procedures associated with the successful management of office operations.

Qualifications: Applicants should have 3 years or more of continuous current sobriety, and have a good working knowledge of the AA Program, Traditions, and Concepts as well as expertise in office operation and a desire and talent for service work. In addition, the successful candidate should be capable of working without direct supervision, be comfortable in a computerized office environment, and be able to be flexible in work scheduling requirements. Although not absolutely required, familiarity with Word, Excel, Office email and Quick Books is a plus.

Requirements: The position requires the dedication and ability to work a flexible schedule of at least 20 hours per week. It is a permanent, part time position. Paid vacation is offered upon completion of a probationary period. A written resume of work experience with references is required. Starting pay is \$8.25 per hour.

Tradition Twelve

And finally, we of Alcoholics Anonymous believe that the principle of anonymity has an immense spiritual significance. It reminds us that we are to place principles before personalities; that we are actually to practice a genuine humility. This to the end that our great blessings may never spoil us; that we shall forever live in thankful contemplation of Him who presides over us all.

One may say that anonymity is the spiritual base, the sure key to all the rest of our Traditions. It has come to stand for prudence and, most importantly, for self-effacement. True consideration for the newcomer if he desires to be nameless; vital protection against misuse of the name Alcoholics Anonymous at the public level; and to each of us a constant reminder that principles come before personal interest – such is the wide scope of this all-embracing principle. In it we see the cornerstone of our security as a movement; at a deeper spiritual level it points us to still greater self-renunciation.

A glance at the Twelve Traditions will instantly assure anyone that “giving up” is the essential idea of them all. In each Tradition, the individual or the group is asked to give up something for our general welfare.

Tradition Twelve, in its mood of humble anonymity, plainly enough comprehends the preceding eleven. The Twelve Points of Tradition are little else than a specific application of the spirit of the Twelve Steps of recovery to our group life and to our relations with society in general. The recovery steps would make each individual AA whole and one with God; the Twelve Points of Tradition would make us one with each other and whole with the world about us. Unity is our aim.

Our AA Traditions are, we trust, securely anchored in those wise precepts: charity, gratitude, and humility. Nor have we forgotten *prudence*. May these virtues ever stand clear before us in our meditations; may Alcoholics Anonymous serve God in happy unison for so long as he may need us.
