One of the first things that many of us hear when coming into AA is that we had to change people, places and things. Now that was easy for me because if I wasn't drinking I didn't like the people and without alcohol none of the places and things held any interest for me either.

Then we hear something that can scare us silly: we only have to change one thing, everything! Change was never a good thing for me. It always meant something bad was coming down the road. The first tiny changes I tried didn't bring disaster down on my head, but I really resisted anything larger than maybe the seat I chose at a meeting or the number of coffees I drank in an hour.

I stumbled onto the above quote while reading some AA history and liked the first part but got very spooked by the rest of it! For several years I managed to do just what was necessary to stay dry. A sponsor pointed out a quote on page 133 of our text book, Alcoholics Anonymous: "We are sure God wants us to be happy, joyous, and free." Yeah, right, but not if that meant actually doing stuff to change!! I was pretty complacent and I really thought that was enough for me.

Several years later I found myself at a place where I felt that if I didn't change something, that I would lose all that I had and become a falling down drunk again...wanting to die and not being able to do so. Scary place to be! That's when I started really giving my Higher Power the care of my life and will. That led to many changes as I worked the Steps and the most remarkable life I have ever known.

The thought of change terrified me but the thought of going back to my former existence became even more so, and today I embrace change as a natural and normal part of life. Dare to take a chance...there is really nothing to lose except our old manner of life that never worked anyway!

## From the Archives

In the February 1983 issue of the *High or Dry*, a column on the front page is titled "What it Was Like." It is a reprint from the *High or Dry* of March 1981. The 1983 article starts "On a damp and dark night in the fall of 1978, a 'Steering Committee Organizational Meeting' was held." This was the start of our present Volusia County Intergroup Services office. The brave souls willing to undertake this impressive task were Ellen and Gran T., Greta and Bill J., Lucille R., Bob R., Joe M., Scotty McC., and Dick M. "Money was scarce and there were a lot of 'doubting Thomases' who let their feelings be known without invitation. However and as always, a canvas of AA's in the area provided sufficient cash and equipment to get the office open and operating on February 5, 1979." The first office was in a house owned by Gran and Ellen T. on Helms Place just across Volusia Avenue (International Speedway Blvd.) from Foote Court and the old Almous Club.

The article continues, "Our first chairman and then D.C.M., Joe M. always insisted that if something is started for the right reason it will survive. Intergroup has survived due to the efforts of all the 500 alcoholics and 34 groups in the Volusia-Flagler area and a loving God who showed us the way." There is an addendum to the article which states that in February 1983 there were an estimated 700 alcoholics and 49 groups in the Volusia-Flagler area. There are now over 170 groups in the area, holding at least 270 meetings a week.

Do you think the original members of the "Steering committee" could have imagined the growth of AA and Intergroup Services in the area? They probably would not be surprised at what has happened. They were members with foresight and a strong belief and faith in the future. The article ends with a tribute to these early movers and shakers. "Not all of us are here today to partake in the good feeling we all have as a result of the spiritual growth experienced through 'putting it all together' but their memories remain and they will never be forgotten. God Bless, Dick M."

(The only member of the original Steering committee remaining in the Daytona Beach area is Lucille R.)
