#### Honesty

I know the biggest word for me in AA is "honesty."

I don't believe this program would work for me  
if I didn't get honest with myself about everything.

Honesty is the easiest word for me to understand  
because it is the exact opposite of what I've been doing all my life.

But I will never be totally honest -- that would make me perfect. Only God is.

If I work on it every day, it will be easier to be honest with myself.

Being honest with me is easier today than it's ever been. Before recovery I lived in a world that I felt was so terrible that being dishonest was the only way I could cope. I tried very hard to be 'cash register' honest but lied to myself and everyone else around me whenever I opened my mouth.

In very early recovery I shared that someone had called me a liar and a thief and that I felt I was neither one. That got the biggest laugh from everyone but me! It took quite a while for me to see how I lied about how my life really was. Reality was not something I dealt with easily. Being honest with others could not come first. It had to start with me. Only after a thorough examination of my life in the 4<sup>th</sup> Step did I start to see how my dishonesty shaded all aspects of my life. What a shock to realize just how dishonest I truly was.

Today I practice honesty with me first, only then can I be truly honest with the world around me.  
Honesty isn't an event -- it's a process.

## FROM THE ARCHIVES

We print new group histories in the Hi 'n Dry as we receive them. Periodically, we also send a copy of the histories we have collected to the Archives at the North Florida Area. The history of your group is an important part of the overall history of the development of Alcoholic Anonymous in Volusia County. Have you sent your group history to the Archives yet? Forms are available at the Intergroup office.

We recently received a request from Ed P of the New Hope Group for a copy of the group history. The group history which had been written was no longer in their notebook and with the change of membership and officers over the years, no one knew the history of the group. We have the New Hope group history in our files written by Ed P. and published in the High 'n Dry in August 2004. Also in our files was a copy of the form registering the group with GSO. In addition, Dave W. wrote to GSO requesting any information that they had about the group. An answer was received within a week.

This is the information which GSO sent:

Correspondence started with GSO March 3, 1992.

Contact person was Sherri Z. and there were 10 members in the group.

Meetings were on Monday night at the Faith Church on Clyde Morris Blvd.

The listing for the group which appears in the Directories through 2012.

This listing contains the name of the contact person (the GSR),  
number of members, day of meeting and location.

It is important to register your group with GSO. When a group is registered, it receives a service number which identifies the group until it is dissolved. All correspondence is filed under this number. Although information can be retrieved without the service number, it is much easier and therefore quicker to get information about a group if you know the service number.

Every time a new GSR is elected by a group and GSO is notified, this information appears in the World Directory of AA groups. The current World Directories are kept in the Intergroup office and are a confidential document. They can be used to find AA contacts outside of our area. In the Archives we have several years of directories in our collection of World Directories. The oldest directory we have was published in 1948. We bring the older directories when we have an Archives display and they receive a lot of attention from the members.

#### **IN REMEMBRANCE OF MARTY H.**

**----October 8th 1930-November 9th 2012----**

**In 1980 Martha H. went into Detox in Chicago,  
Illinois. 30 days later she walked into the rooms on  
Amsden Drive. She became a member May 20<sup>th</sup>,  
1980 (her last drink). That night she was given the  
keys to open & she was in awe. After seven years  
the group disbanded and they moved to what is  
now "Primary Purpose" where she held the  
position of Secretary/ Treasurer for 22 years. She  
also had the phone lines on Saturday nights for  
approximately 10 years. She took the responsibility  
of that position so diligently that she never made  
any plans that would interfere with the importance  
of finding a meeting or doing what she could to  
help a fellow alcoholic in need. Monthly folding of  
the "High & Dry" was also a constant in her life. For  
at least 20 years, she was known for making the  
Anniversary Cookie with love and humility, large  
enough for all in attendance & I'm sure many  
anniversaries are wonderful memories for those  
celebrating their sobriety. Marty never told her  
story out loud but she lived the Steps and loved her  
life in recovery. Sober for 33 years, she was our  
gift from the grace of God.**
