OF MY UNDERSTANDING

When I came to AA, I was desperate to stay sober. I believed you when you said that my sobriety depended on the deflation of self in order to seek a power greater than myself, but that was a tall order. These concepts were so foreign to me that fear almost prevented me from even trying.

Back when I was still deciding whether or not I was to be a member of AA, I asked what it meant when they say "of my understanding"? I was asked to imagine standing in the ocean with a wave coming towards me. Now imagine who would be more powerful. Since then my understanding has grown. It grew slowly with each passing experience. In the beginning, it was the people in the rooms who had their developmental relationships with the God of their understanding. The Big Book became a trusted Higher Power and still is. When I stopped exhausting myself and imposing self will to find God's will, that was when I would finally see all the miracles laid at my feet. As they say, all I had to do was get out of my way. Thank God I didn't have to do any of this on my own.

The question begged, "Was the obsession removed by me or God?" "Why was I sober on this day when all the fight before to save my own life was impossible?" One day I believed, one day I had faith, and now I trust that faith. The steps were my catalyst and for that I am grateful. The God of my understanding is progressive. Today I pray to something infinite that I will never stop learning from.

The 12 and 12 talks of how those who have come to use prayer and meditation would no more do without it then they would do without air, food or water. The gratitude that I have for what God has revealed to me makes it easy to want to display that thankfulness with genuine prayer, meditation and the benevolent act of love that I offer when I give hope to the next alcoholic that walks into these rooms convinced that they too will never develop that relationship with God.

THE TOMOKA GROUP

In honor of the Tomoka Group's 12th Anniversary this month (See the Events page for celebration details.), here is some interesting history of the Group:

The Tomoka Group was founded on February 4, 2002. The founding members were Kenny P., Donnie C., Michelle M., and Darren S. The group met at Tomoka Christian Church on Monday nights at 8 pm. The group was then with District 32. In October 2003, the group went into inactive status.

On August 21, 2004 the group was revived with members Joe M., and Dave W., at Florida Memorial Hospital Ormond and the format was an Open Speaker Meeting. The group met on Saturday nights at 8 pm.

When Florida Hospital Ormond closed in June 2009, the group moved to its current location at Faith Lutheran Church. With this move, the group was transferred from District 32 to District 21. The membership base stayed between 2-3 members (Jennifer L., Keryn C., Debbie S., Brandon L., and Tank B.) for several years. It is now at a high of 5 home group members, but that hasn't affected attendance; in fact we had over 100 people at the last meeting of 2013 when Bob W., spoke on his 80th birthday!

On Oct 24, 2009 the group has its first "Eatin' Meetin'" which has evolved into a quarterly event. The Eatin' Meetin' begins at 7 pm with Eatin' (food and fellowship) and the Meetin' at 8 pm during which there is a 3-speaker raffle.

On August 24, 2013 the group hosted the AA and Other Medications Workshop with Dr. Bobby from Willingway Hospital in Statesboro, Georgia.

Tradition Two

For our group purpose there is but one ultimate authority, a loving God as he may express himself in our group conscience. Our leaders are but trusted servants, they do not govern.

Sooner or later, every AA comes to depend upon a Power greater than himself. He finds that the God of his understanding is not only a source of strength, but also a source of *positive direction*. Realizing that some fraction of that infinite resource is now available, his life takes on an entirely different complexion. He experiences a new inner security together with such a sense of destiny and purpose as he has never known before. As each day passes, our AA reviews his mistakes and vicissitudes. He learns from daily experience what his remaining character defects are and becomes ever more willing that they be removed. In this fashion, he improves his conscious contact with God.

Every AA group follows this same cycle of development. We are coming to realize that each group, as well as each individual, is a special entity, not quite like any other. Though AA groups are basically the same, each group does have its own special atmosphere, its own peculiar state of development. We believe that every AA group has a conscience. It is the collective conscience of its own membership. Daily experience informs and instructs this conscience. The group begins to recognize its own defects of character and, one by one, these are removed or lessened. As this process continues, the group becomes better able to receive right direction for its own affairs.

Because each AA, of necessity, has a sensitive and responsive conscience, and because alcohol will discipline him severely if he backslides, we are finding we have little need for manmade rules or regulations. Despite the fact that we do veer off at times on tangents, we are becoming more able to depend absolutely on the long-term stability of the AA group itself. With respect to its own affairs, the collective conscience of the group will, given time, almost surely demonstrate its perfect dependability. The group conscience will, in the end, prove a far more infallible guide for group affairs than the decision of any individual member, however good or wise he may be.
