GOD FOUND ME

"I believe that God found me, more than I found him. It was similar to watching a child walk; he falls down again and again, but it is better not to try to help him **until he comes to realize that he cannot do it alone – and extends his hand.** I had gotten myself into a position where I had no other place to turn; I was at a point of almost complete despair. Then, and only then, did I honestly and simply ask God to help me. He came to me instantly, and I could feel His presence, even as I do this moment."

My experience is very similar to our friend from Nashville, Tennessee as quoted in the passage above from page 24 of *"Came to Believe..."*. Similarly to my disease of alcoholism, hope was an exceptionally *patient* and *tolerant* observer that serenely waited for my willingness to concede. For me, my innumerable efforts and vigor for successful drinking had been entirely exhausted. Subsequently, the hand of AA was there to help me, and I became willing to extend my hand and latch onto what I miraculously came to find. **Hope! - Anonymous**

I feel my spiritual growth over these past thirty years has been **very gradual and steady.** I have no desire to "graduate" from A.A. I try to keep my memories green by staying active in A.A. – a couple of meetings weekly. *For the new agnostic or atheist just coming in,* I will try to give very briefly my milestones in recovery.

1. The first power I found greater than myself was John Barleycorn.
2. The A.A. Fellowship became my Higher Power for the first two years.
3. Gradually, I came to believe that *God and Good were synonymous and found in all of us.*
4. And I found that by *meditating and trying to tune in on my better self for guidance and answers,* I became more comfortable and steady. – **J.B., San Diego, CA**

1. Offer *no advice unless* it is asked.
2. Listen to other people’s dreams and help them in the way they wish to be helped.
3. Encourage them to find their own strength.
4. **Reserve judgement** – At all times.
5. Admit that you don’t know all the answers.
6. **Build confidence** in the other person until his own judgement becomes clear.
7. Have faith in the overall rightness of God’s purpose in this world and the next.
8. *Dwell on what is right instead of what is wrong.*
9. Realize the core of Divine Being in each person. Respect it.
10. *Never discount the other person’s good intentions.*

Another part of this same card has the 3rd Step Prayer and the Indian Prayer:

“Great Spirit, May I not render judgement upon another until I have walked for one moon in his moccasins.”

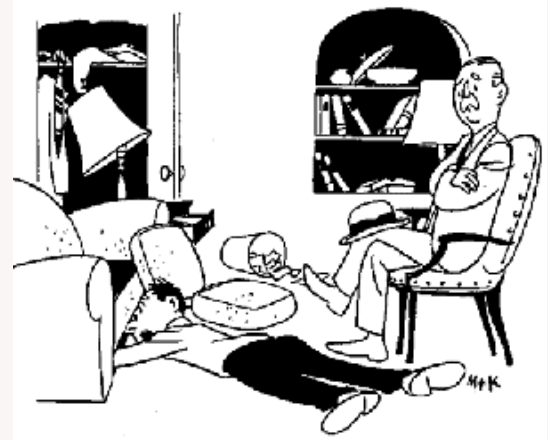
Tradition Two

“For our group purpose there is but one ultimate authority—a loving God as He may express Himself in our group conscience. Our leaders are but trusted servants; they do not govern.”

TRADITIONS CHECKLIST from the A.A. Grapevine. These questions were originally published in the AA Grapevine in conjunction with a series on the Twelve Traditions that began in November 1969 and ran through September 1971. While they were originally intended primarily for individual use, many AA groups have since used them as a basis for wider discussion.

Practice These Principles...

1. Do I criticize or do I trust and support my group officers, AA committees, and office workers? Newcomers? Old-timers?
2. Am I absolutely trustworthy, even in secret, with AA Twelfth Step jobs or other AA responsibility?
3. Do I look for credit in my AA jobs? Praise for my AA ideas?
4. Do I have to save face in group discussion, or can I yield in good spirit to the group conscience and work cheerfully along with it?
5. Although I have been sober a few years, am I still willing to serve my turn at AA chores?
6. In group discussions, do I sound off about matters on which I have no experience and little knowledge?

HEARD IT THROUGH THE GRAPEVINE Your Editor's Corner

I recently heard an A.A. speaker state, **“I worked hard ‘cause I wanted this bad!”** The line caught my attention immediately, and I could identify! Subsequently, the sentiment brought me back to the steps and thoughtful meditation on Step Two. The realization that I had yearned for a Higher Power to guide my thoughts, words, and actions took me by complete surprise. **I wanted it bad!**

Initially, I gave little thought to Chapter 5, *We Agnostics*, in the “*Big Book*.” As more was revealed over time, I began to truly appreciate the depth and gravity of the text. Maybe a **loving and caring** Higher Power serviced alcoholics much better than what I was worshipping? So, I decided to throw caution to the wind and take a great leap of faith. I was reminded that: “Nothing Changes if Nothing Changes!”

As the “*Big Book*” of Alcoholics Anonymous states on p. 54, “We found, too, that we had been worshipers. What a state of mental goose-flesh that used to bring on! Had we not variously worshipped people, sentiment, things, money, and ourselves? And then, with a better motive, had we not worshipfully beheld the sunset, the sea, or a flower? Who of us had not loved something or somebody? How much did these feelings, these loves, these worships, have to do with pure reason? Little or nothing, we saw at last. “It was impossible to say that we had no capacity for faith, or love, or worship. In one form or another **we had been living by faith and little else.**”

I had to admit that I indeed took great pleasure in worshipping people, money, things, and myself. However, for me, this practice always seemed to lead to emotional pain, loneliness, and confusion. I have great admiration and I’m grateful for my friend who **“worked hard ‘cause [she] wanted this bad!”** In my experience, change isn’t always easy, but it appears to be necessary for sober living. It has been said that, “growth demands a **temporary surrender** of security.” Steps One & Two paved the pathway to better living for me, and for that, I’m grateful!
