Experience, Strength, and Hope

The Internet is the same friend to AA members away from home today as the pay phone was in Bill Wilson's time. I found AA Egypt online, and there was contact information for a few people here. I picked a guy named Tom and sent him an e-mail. He replied right away, said he was out of town for a couple of weeks, and copied two other local members whom he promised would contact me. (Just like in the US, most people carry smart phones and get their e-mail instantly.) One of them, Ahmad, e-mailed me right away and said he'd be happy to take me to a meeting. He said he was out of town also, but he was headed back that evening. If he got back to town early enough, he said, he would call me and we would go. If not, he would call to make plans for a different meeting.

I didn't hear from him for a couple of days, so I sent another e-mail yesterday. He called almost immediately, apologized profusely, and said he had to go out of town again and that's why he hadn't called. He went to great lengths to tell me where the meeting was today and exactly how to get there. Knowing I would be employing a taxi driver who did not speak English, Ahmad told me what to say to the driver in Arabic, and said if I had any trouble at all I should call him immediately and he would speak to the driver. I did my best with my amateur Arabic, and the driver had to ask around, but he did end up dropping me off directly in front of St. Joseph's Catholic Church, near downtown. This was no small feat - it was about 30 minutes away from my apartment, in a city of 20 million people, on a very large and highly developed island neighborhood in the middle of the Nile. No cab driver can be expected to know the name of every street in the city - but this guy did a great job. We passed a number of embassies in the area, and lots and lots of small businesses. I was absolutely amazed at the ability of the driver to ask around and find where I was going, and get me to the exact place I sought. I was pleased enough not to mind when he charged me way too much for the ride. (It happens - part of being a foreigner. Same thing happened to me in New York City a few years back! On the other hand, I won't miss the dough - about \$8 - and he has a family to feed. It's all good)

Group-Where it all Begins, and Self-Support: Where Money and Spirituality Mix, among others.

"While contributions cover each group's rent and other expenses, the 7th Tradition is essential at every level of A.A. service. It is both a privilege and a responsibility for groups and members to ensure that not only their group, but also their intergroup/central office, local services, district, area and the General Service Office remain self-supporting. This keeps A.A. free of outside influences that might divert us from our primary purpose – to help the alcoholic who still suffers." (Service material from the General Service Office)

Some of you may wonder if there is a specific formula which directs this breakdown for each home group. When you became a Treasurer at your home group you hopefully received or inherited a copy of Memo to AA Group Treasurer. This publication provides info specific to the breakdown of AA funds in areas fortunate enough to have an intergroup or central office.

- 10% of the total goes to your District,
- 10% of the total does to the North Florida area,
- 30% of the total does to the General Service office in New York and
- 50% of the total goes to your local Intergroup.

With your contributions your District is able to continue planning and organizing special events, workshops, parties and representation at area assemblies (We are not a glum lot!) I encourage you to discuss your giving plan at your next group conscious meeting!
