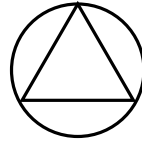

When I came into AA I found that surrender was an absolute necessity and still, after some years living this way of life, surrender continues to be vital to my health and wellbeing. So many situations arise in daily life that I am powerless over, even though my sick ego tries to convince me that the 'great I' can take care of everything!

The Big Book of Alcoholics Anonymous tells me over and over again that my ego is a liar. On page 66 in the discussion of the first part of the 4th Step it says "...the more we fought and tried to have our own way, the worse matters got."

After a lifetime of banging my head against every stone wall I could find, it finally becomes clear to me that all I am doing is causing great pain to me and others. I would love to say that once I realized this, all is well and life is rosy. However I am human and I need a constant daily reminder because the sick ego still wants to take over and rule my life.

What I found that helps me is to start each day surrendering my will and my life to the will of my Higher Power by reading the 10th and 11th Steps from the Big Book. On page 84 it states that "...we have ceased fighting anything and anyone..." Constant reinforcement of the paradox that Bill W. spoke of in the above quote from 'AA Comes of Age' provides me with that "...daily reprieve" mentioned on page 85 of our Big Book.

"Our real purpose is to fit ourselves to be of maximum service to God and the people about us." BB page 77. This only happens in my life when I follow the guidelines set down so long ago and that continue to work in millions of lives today.

FROM THE ARCHIVES

Recently, several Grapevines were donated to the archives. The December 1984 and January 1985 issues are an addition to the collection. We have early issues from June 1951, June 1955 and August and September 1958. The collection starts at 1977 and each year is missing a few issues until 1991. Years are complete from 1992 (except for 1993) until 2007. We are missing issues in 2008, 2009 and 2010 but 2011, 2012 and 2013 are complete to the July 2013 issue. Recently we were able to provide assistance to an AA member who was looking for an article written by a local member which was published in a 1993 issue.

In the Archives we have several facsimiles of the first Grapevine printed in June 1944. This issue is very different from the magazine we currently read. It is unbound, 8 pages, reproduced on paper which is 10 x12 inches. At the top of the front page is a request for anonymity as well as "Please do not quote or reprint without our permission." Articles on the front page are *Two Yale Savants Stress Alcoholism as True Disease* and "Grapevine" in Bow (article on how the "Grapevine" began.) There is an editorial written by Bill W., "Points of View" which are letters to the "Grapevine," and AA news-*AA Goes to Sea, Corporation Meets, Central Committee*. Central Office notes by Bill W., and several other AA member's letters and brief stories. The Grapevine site on the internet says that Bill edited most of the issues for several years as well as writing many articles. The book, *Language of the Heart* is a collection of all the articles written by Bill W. for the Grapevine.

Do you have literary flare? Have you always wanted to write something? Do you want to share an interesting incident in your sobriety? Write an article for the Grapevine. This month I am suggesting the We, AA members of Volusia County, form a PI/CPC volunteer group that meets at District 32's monthly meeting to service all the aspects and needs of Public Information and Cooperation with Professional Community. This role and need has become far too large for one individual to adequately provide and navigate. We are reaching the still suffering but through your help with our Higher Power and service to our fellow man we can achieve together what I can not do alone.

What is PI/CPC? PI provides A.A. members to speak to non-A.A. organizations and groups. Their purpose is primarily to explain what A.A. is, and what A.A. is not. They are volunteer local A.A. members, but are not official spokespersons for A.A. This service is referred to as "Public Information and Cooperation with Professional Communities" or PI/CPC. The purpose of P.I. service work is to provide accurate A.A. information to the public when requested. P.I. volunteers visit schools, businesses and community meetings for this purpose. They also serve as resources for our friends in the local media, emphasizing our Traditions of anonymity, singleness of purpose and non-affiliation, as well as offering A.A. public service announcements to radio and television stations.

I stopped at the Intergroup office for supplies and asked if anyone had agreed to take over the Hi & Dry editor's position as the current editor was due to rotate out after a two year commitment. The answer was that no one had come forward yet and I said "Somebody needs to step up to take this."

I'd gotten home and started to check email when this strange thought popped into my head...."wait, I'm somebody!" I actually had no idea if I could do this job, didn't even know what it entailed but lots of others had done it over the years and it couldn't be all that hard if ordinary AA members did it.

I sent an email to the Intergroup office and the editor stating that I would be willing if the Steering Committee thought I was qualified. I was invited to the next Intergroup Steering Committee meeting, met the members of the committee and was appointed to the position. What I learned then was that God does not call the qualified, He qualifies the called.

Now I am getting close to that two year mark myself and will be rotating out of this position at the end of 2013. I know someone reading this will think the same thing I did..."hey, I'm somebody...if she can do it so can I" and will call the Intergroup office and/or email admin@adaytona.org or editor@adaytona.org and step up to the plate. I have had the greatest fun in this position and know that you will too, so whoever you are, I look forward to hearing from you and working with you!!

THE SEVENTH TRADITION

"Every AA group ought to be fully self-supporting, declining outside contributions."

'Passing the basket' at meetings is our way of meeting our responsibility for the work of AA. Our own contributions support the group, the General Service Office, and all AA activities. We do have to be practical. A group can hardly hold its regular meetings on a street corner, and an empty basket won't fill a coffee urn. As soon as we become active in a group, we learn how many expenses are involved in making its meetings effective. Then our horizons broaden. What about that intergroup or central office so many of us called for help? Phone companies don't give free service. Beyond our own locality, we learn about the AA General Service Office and the work it does for groups everywhere. AA activity is self-supporting at all levels, and in every case the responsibility comes right back to us, the individual members, for we *are* AA. We have put a limit . . . on the amount members may leave to AA in their wills or contribute annually while living, so that none of us can buy influence in AA, no matter how rich we are. When a group treasury grows too fat, beyond a prudent reserve . . . groups can lose unity and stray from their primary purpose. But there's one simple solution that strengthens our unity and advances our purpose: Give the excess to AA activities and services.

One thing I've learned in AA is not to be an alarmist.

Still, around the groups I attend, it *does* seem that we AA's sometimes get a little funny about the Traditions. The archives were displayed at the Founders' Day Dinner and we ran the AA *history in Volusia County Timeline* slide show continuously during the fellowship time and dinner.
