## FROM THE ARCHIVES

Recently we received an old newspaper page from the New York Daily News dated January 27, 1940 from Suzanne W. in New Smyrna Beach. This page contains a regular feature of the newspaper, "The Inquiring Reporter." The question asked of the "man on the street" in Midtown Manhattan shows the attitude of people toward alcohol consumption in this era. "It's a proud boast with many men that they can take liquor or let it alone. From your observation, do you think this is true?"

#1. Woman -New York City: My crowd is Navy and Army officers and their wives. They can take it or leave it alone because they are disciplined. They never drink on duty. They have to stay alert, always.

#2. Man -White Plains (engineer): The average person can take or leave it alone. It is usually the heavy drinker who makes the boast and when he attempts to quit, he usually goes back to drinking.

#3. Woman-New Yorker: The heavy drinker who makes the boast sincerely believes he can leave liquor alone but he never really wants to stop drinking. If he wants to stop for his health, he has to go under a doctor's care in order to keep away from liquor.

#4. Man-New York City (bartender): The average man who drinks a lot every day can't take it or leave it. It's only the occasional drinking man who with exceptional will power can leave liquor alone when he wants to.

#5. Woman-New York City (store manager): When a man makes such a boast, it is because he is perturbed about his drinking and his defense mechanism is operating. He boasts to soothe his own feelings.

#6. Man-Brooklyn (engineer): I don't think that alcohol is as habit forming as drugs. A man who drinks heavily usually has a cause for his drinking such as an illness, like a kidney condition.

These were the attitudes about drinking at the beginning of the 1940s, seventy+ years ago, a year and a half before the Jack Alexander article. (March 1941) Do you think the answers would be the same today? Do you think the general public is better educated about alcohol consumption and alcoholism today?

## Experience, Strength, and Hope

First, I decided to send this message only to my AA friends all over the US - and I'm amazed at just how large and diverse this list is! I see names of people in Florida, Michigan, Vermont, and places in between! I have been blessed with a LOT of AA friends all over the country - and now, I'm beginning to make new AA friendships here in Egypt!

For those who haven't heard - I moved to Egypt a little less than a month ago, and am now living in Cairo, near the international airport, teaching math at the American International School in Egypt. Today I made it to my first AA meeting here in Cairo, and I'm happy to report that AA is for all intent & purposes the same here as anywhere else I've attended meetings - and that includes areas spread out over half the US: Vermont, Florida, Michigan, Rhode Island, Minnesota, and several other places I can't remember!

I didn't know what to expect when I first considered moving to Egypt - I was certain that it was God's will for me to do this, but I was somewhat apprehensive about my program. Egypt is primarily a Muslim nation, and alcohol is heavily frowned on in Islam. My first year sober I recall attending meetings with a physician who said alcohol was forbidden in his home country - he was from Pakistan. I had read that alcohol was available for purchase in Cairo at certain places, but it is far from universally available as it is in the US. And so I didn't know if I would find the same sort of AA community I had become familiar with in the US - or find English speaking meetings.

I recall having similar fears when I moved to Vermont in 2004: I knew there were AA meetings in Vermont, but I was leaving the support group I had relied on for more than 14 years, and I was afraid! Took me a while to realize the obvious - it was God, working through the group, that had been keeping me sober. And that's the way it still is - all I have to do is provide the willingness, and God provides the support group everywhere I go. As always, God is running things, and I don't have to worry about it. #### **Tradition Six**

**"An AA group ought never endorse, finance or lend the AA name to any related facility or outside enterprise, lest problems of money, property or prestige divert us from our primary purpose."**

In my own life I have found that having too many concerns and issues that I am involved in means that I am scattered and every interest suffers. In my sobriety I also find that being divided in my focus does me no good whatsoever. If these things can have such an impact on my life and sobriety, how can I fail to see what damage this type of diversity can do to the program of Alcoholics Anonymous?

Being divided in our purpose and focus means that when newcomers arrive at our doors we may not be there to help them. If we are off crusading for this or that cause (though the causes may be very good) we cannot possibly be doing what AA has done from the very beginning. Helping alcoholics achieve and maintain sobriety.

History is littered with other programs similar to ours over the years that vanished due to outside interests interfering with their original purpose. Let us not forsake our primary purpose...it's worked very well for 77 years and God willing it will continue to do what it has always done.
