All of my life I lived in fear of everything and everyone. The only escape I found as a youngster was anger and fantasy. I made up elaborate stories about my parents, my home life and my school life. Unfortunately I was the only one who believed them but that didn't matter because the fantasy world got me away from what was really going on in my life. Somewhere along the way alcohol came into play and that helped me stay hidden for longer and longer in that false world I created for myself.

When I finally made my way to the rooms of Alcoholics Anonymous, the fantasies got different but still ruled who and what I wanted to be. The real me couldn't face people, situations or anything to do with life as most folks know it. Being so closed up and not really knowing who I was kept me in fear for several years as I attended meetings, did service and otherwise acted like I knew what life was about when I really had no clue.

I don't know how close I was to drinking again and dying...maybe not physically, but in all other ways. Before I reached that point, God intervened in my life and led me to a group of people who showed me what I was missing all along...a right relation with God and my fellows through a thorough 4th Step.

Today I am so grateful and really relate to the above quote...I embrace all of life, good, bad or indifferent. The reality of God's world as I live in it today is a beautiful thing. I do my best to pass that along as I live this way of life and "trudge the Road of Happy Destiny (BB, p. 164) "

FROM THE ARCHIVES

Recently a meeting was started at the Almous Club based on The Lotus and Rose Big Book Study guide. This was a new method of step study to me and I thought I would share what I found out about it. I was also very intrigued by the name which evokes images of nature and beauty, peace and serenity.

In 2004 in Sweden this method of Big Book step study was found on the internet. This information and the complete study guide can be downloaded at the website www.Lotusandrose.com. The Lotus and Rose site suggests a fuller inner spiritual life can be gained through *openness, growth, change...discovery*.

The step study can be done with a sponsor - one on one or in a group of 8 to 12 AA members making up a "step study team." The team should be made up of 3 or 4 members who have already worked the steps with this format and 6 or 8 members working the steps for the first time. The team selects a meeting place and time keeping in mind that this meeting is not a substitute for a regular AA meeting. They exchange contact information in order to provide support, motivation and encouragement to each other through the step process which takes from 15 to 20 weeks. At the completion of the process the group disbands.

There is a set meeting format which includes discussion questions and assignments for each week. The study guide includes direct references to specific pages in the Big Book which relate to the current step being studied as well as pages in The Twelve and Twelve used for reference.

A first timer commits to do one more study group after he has completed the current step study. Team members agree to call at least one other member of the group at least once a week. No one is added after the start of the study and a member can be dropped with the agreement of other group members if he has a slip, is not committed to the study or misses a meeting. It is recommended that teams not be co-ed because of problems which may arise during the 4th step study. Are you getting complacent in your program? Investigating one of the Big Book step study groups in our area may be just what you need to add a little Zing to your sobriety.

"An AA group ought never endorse, finance or lend the AA name to any related facility or outside enterprise, lest problems of money, property and prestige divert us from our primary purpose."

"We found that there are all kinds of goals, motives and ambitions...and the good name of AA could be smeared.

The 'related facility' may be an outside group combating alcoholism—or an enterprise that AAs want to start. Toward outside agencies dealing with alcoholism, the AA policy is 'cooperation but not affiliation'. A group cooperates, for example, by welcoming referrals from clinics or by sponsoring AA groups in Institutions.

AA members employed by outside agencies 'wear two hats'....in the job, they may be alcoholism counselors; they are *not* 'AA counselors.' At meetings, they're just AAs, not alcoholism experts.

There are two major danger areas. But our course has been charted and the hazards clearly marked. If we steer clear of them, we should have smooth sailing...

1. **AFFILIATION OF AA GROUPS WITH ANYTHING OUTSIDE AA**
2. **ANY ACTIVITY THAT WOULD HARM AA AS A WHOLE."**
