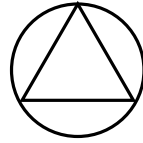

SERVICE IS GOOD FOR THE SOUL!

I remember being a newcomer and not knowing what to expect or how to approach the whole AA thing. I felt overwhelmed by the whole experience besides the fact that I was having a hard enough time functioning without a drink. I started going to meetings and was told to find a sponsor. Someone approached me and said she would be my sponsor. I heard that I was supposed to do what my sponsor said without question! That did not resonate well with me but I listened.

I was critical and bitter but kept it to myself (so I thought). I would go to meeting after meeting and watch people talk, joke and laugh with one another. I felt so uncomfortable and hated just walking into a room. I knew I wanted what they had so I decided to find something to do...just so I could be around everyone. I started off by helping with putting away chairs and then coming early to help set up the room. I never spoke to anyone. Eventually I volunteered to make coffee. Everyone came up to thank me, which was embarrassing but secretly it felt good to be useful.

Eventually, people started to recognize me and went out of their way to say hello and ask how I was doing. I struggled with being friendly and social. I did not trust anyone. My sponsor took me on 12-step calls speaking in hospitals and rehabs. I thought I had nothing to offer but others would be grateful that I shared my story. Little by little, I became less self-conscious and more willing to reach out to help others. I did not see my own growth but these baby steps took me beyond myself. I stopped thinking about myself and more about my fellows. I was taught never to say "no" in AA...to always help, show up and/or speak when asked. I have driven people to meetings, gone on 12 steps calls, taken folks to hospitals or rehabs, cleaned up at meetings, served food, cooked food, washed tables, arranged rooms, sat with someone who needed an ear, and many other jobs which ultimately helped me be a better person than I was before.

There are all kinds of service and it is often not just restricted to people within the program of Alcoholics Anonymous. We become better people when we learn to help others. Big or small, everything we do for others brings change in us. There is humility in service. Humility brings change. Change brings sobriety and a new way of life. Our new way of life helps us help others. Who knew that washing a plate or putting away a chair could mean so much?!

Experience, Strength & Hope – Accessibilities: Letting Your Needs be Known

They always think the guy in the wheel chair is the one to do accessibilities; while actually he is the one who needs accessibilities. I figured this out a long time ago and even had a piece printed about it in the 90's in the High or Dry newsletter. Having a special need seen to for a recovering person in terms of access to the meeting is not the responsibility of the group, but the responsibility of the person seeking access to a 12 step meeting.

It is impossible for every group that meets to have every contingency in place to cover the special needs; however when the person in need makes their needs known, the group will if it is able – or if unable will help seek out the location of a group that is able to – provide those special issues of accessibility. What may seem a difficult problem to solve becomes easy when the Intergroup Representative takes the need up at the monthly IGR meeting so the Accessibilities committee is alerted and experienced solvers are put on the case.

Neither the individual seeker nor the group should be made to feel that they are inadequate or that their needs are causing an inconvenience; access to recovery for everyone is the mission statement for these 12 step programs. It is not only the matter of an available structurally safe handicapped parking space needed, but to know that once inside the building the person in a wheel chair will be able to get to and into the rest room facilities, will be able to negotiate the room and will have the same stress free possibility to recover available them as everyone else. If it is a special need for a sign language interpreter to translate the meeting so a deaf member will be able to participate, or for literature to be presented in Braille so a blind member will be able read along, the need must be made known to the group by the person who has the need. Some groups meet in a venue set up for children to be occupied during the meeting but separate from it... REBOS has a special room set up for children to be in that is safe but separate.

Access to 12 step recovery is available to EVERYONE. It is a matter of wanting it badly enough to let your needs be known to the group, and then following through with the business of recovery. It is as simple as that, YOUR recovery should not be a daunting proposition because of any outside factors... let your needs be known and a way will be found to see those needs are met.

THE A.A. TRADITION SIX

An A.A. group ought never endorse, finance or lend the A.A. name to any related facility or outside enterprise, lest problems of money, property and prestige divert us from our primary purpose.

The “related facility” may be an outside group combating alcoholism—or an enterprise that A.A.’s want to start. It was the latter that most often confronted the young Fellowship. Outside agencies were pretty scarce in those days, and some members thought A.A. should cover the whole alcoholism field. Led by a “super-promoter” (as the “Twelve and Twelve” describes him), one group built an all-purpose center, including a section for drying-out treatment. Picture any group tackling such a project! Arguments over cost, architecture, staff, fees, medication, and rules might even make the local paper. (And pity the poor newcomer straying into the group— “We’ll get around to you in a minute.”)

Though that ambitious center failed, some individual members have since founded successful clubhouses, rest farms, halfway houses, etc. The enterprises are run by these A.A.’s and patronized by other members or prospective members. But money and property are involved. Therefore, it has proved wise to keep the operation of the facility completely separate from that of any A.A. group, and to keep “A.A.” or terms like “Twelfth Step” out of the name.

Toward outside agencies dealing with alcoholism, the A.A. policy is “cooperation but not affiliation.” A group cooperates, for example, by welcoming referrals from clinics or by sponsoring A.A. groups in institutions.
