From the Archives

As is our custom, when we receive a new group history at the Archives, it is published in the Hi 'n Dry.

The “New Beginnings Group”, located at Florida Hospital in Deland began meeting each Sunday night at 6pm back in 2008. Frank F. (District 19 PI/CPC chair) agreed to sponsor this group. For the 1st 6 months, only 2 people, Frank and Joe L. were in attendance.

Today the New Beginnings Group averages between 35 – 40 participants in each meeting. The group draws from the Detox floor at the hospital as well as the nearby Haven treatment residential center.

The focus of each open meeting is usually on the 1st 3 steps of our 12 step program.

This group gives us a wonderful example of the 12th step "suggestion" from Bill and Bob which says "we tried to carry this message to alcoholics."

Right on ---New Beginnings Group of Deland, may you have continued success.

The report from the 12 Step Coordinator is very sad this month. As hard as she and VCIG try, there have been no new volunteers added to our lists. When calls for help come in to a desk volunteer or Phone Army volunteer, how do they tell someone desperately asking for help that there is no help available? How do we explain that not enough people are interested in their need for a return phone call a ride to a meeting?

This is a very difficult situation and we really need your help....you can set your own hours as well as what help you are willing to offer. Some people just need to talk to someone who has been where they are. It's what Alcoholics Anonymous has always been about, one alcoholic talking with another. Please think about giving back what you were given. There will be a 12 Step sign-up table available at the Unity Picnic. Stop by and talk to someone about this service.

Our membership ought to include all who suffer from alcoholism. Hence we may refuse none who wish to recover. Nor ought AA membership ever depend upon money or conformity. Any two or three alcoholics gathered together for sobriety may call themselves an AA group, provided that, as a group, they have no other affiliation. The long form of this Tradition adds much more to our understanding of the reason for the Tradition. Many years ago there were rules for membership and lots of people didn't qualify and consequently died horrible alcoholic deaths. Today we are very willing to open our doors to anyone regardless of anything. We are all different but in this one respect we are so very alike. We are alcoholics and desperately need each other to get better. We know we can't do this thing alone because many of us have tried that and know that it just doesn't work. I need to see where I was and where I could be without you. Practicing love and tolerance can be hard when faced with our old behavior in others but for the good of the whole it is well worth the effort.
