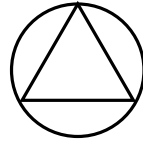

FROM THE ARCHIVES

The Twelve Traditions evolved from the correspondence received at the General Service Office in New York from groups seeking solutions to their problems in the early days of AA. The Traditions were meant to guide groups to function and problem solve according to the principles as suggested by our early founders: requirements for membership in AA, singleness of purpose, non-endorsement of outside enterprises, professionalism, public controversy and anonymity. The early members felt if a unified code was not set down that the whole organization would flounder and dissolve as others in the past had done when they spread themselves too thin and became involved in issues separate from their primary purpose. (pg. 203, *AA Comes of Age*)

The long edition of the Twelve Traditions appeared in the AA Grapevine May 6, 1946, followed by articles in future issues explaining each of the traditions in detail. A pamphlet based on these articles was published by Headquarters at a later date. The short form of the Traditions was published in 1947. In 1953 the book, *Twelve Steps and Twelve Traditions* was published. The Twelve Traditions were presented to the First International AA Convention in Cleveland, Ohio and were unanimously accepted by the membership. Older members now felt that the future survival of Alcoholics Anonymous was assured.

All this information was acquired as I searched *AA comes of Age* for an explanation or some reference to a change in the wording of Tradition Six. In a recent correspondence from a member (Dave M.) who collects early Twenty-Four Hour a Day books, he stated: The Daytona book has on page 371 AA's 12 Traditions and tradition 6 reads as it was presented and accepted in its short form in 1950 "An AA Group ought never endorse, finance or lend the AA name to any related facility or outside enterprise lest problems of money, property and prestige divert us from our primary spiritual aim." It appears that the Twenty Four Hour book is the first book to have the Traditions of AA in it. The 12&12 first appeared in April of 53, and tradition 6 was changed to "primary purpose"..... did Rich Walker have the Traditions of AA in his book before they were officially adopted in June 1950? Interesting thought.

By the way, in all my research, I did not find any reference to the wording change in *AA Comes of Age*. Dave M. said he is searching in the early (1947-1950) Grapevines.

way, and it just didn't work. As the
Fellowship was nearing its ten-year
mark, the office that served as
headquarters "asked the groups to list
their membership rules and send them
in," Bill W. recalled. "If all of these edicts
had been in force everywhere at once, it
would have been practically impossible
for any alcoholic to have ever joined AA.
About nine-tenths of our oldest and best
members could never have got by!" So
the rule books went out the window and
were replaced by one uncomplicated
sentence: Tradition Three.**

**We've thrown away all membership rules
and regulations that might keep you out.
We want you to have the same chance
for sobriety that we have had.**
