IN THE BEGINNING

In the beginning, I cried. I cried tears of sadness, of fear, of anger, of loneliness, of frustration. I cried for what I could have been and what I had become. I cried all my feelings at once. I don't like to cry. So instead, all my life, I drank.

When drinking stopped working and I was introduced to AA, I had a new experience. I began feeling long lost emotions all at the same time, with fear as the front-runner. I sat in meetings and shook. My anxiety was overwhelming. But it wasn't just in AA. I was afraid of life in its entirety. I couldn't walk through a convenience store without having a panic attack. I don't even know what I was afraid of. For the first time since I was a child, life was real again, but I wasn't.

In a very literal way, the people of AA helped me grow up. You taught me how to write a check and how to pay my bills. You taught me to sweep the floor when it got dirty and not to grocery shop when I was hungry. More than that, you taught me what it meant to have true relationships and how to stop thinking I was the only one who mattered in this world. I watched you drop everything for an alcoholic in need. I heard your stories of triumph over alcohol and all your good and bad struggles with life. You showed me, by your example, the true meaning of unconditional love.

Today, I have all of you who share my joys and sorrows. Our celebrations are doubled and our worries are halved. I still have fears and some days are easier than others, but you taught me that I am safe and protected no matter what life brings. So today, I also have hope, the greatest feeling I've ever had. Today, I am privileged to be a part of the people who will hold you up when you don't have the strength to stand through your beginning.

FROM THE ARCHIVES

Another item from our files. This article was printed in the Hi 'n Dry several years ago and could stand a second look.

The Sociology Department at Duke University did a study on "Peace of Mind." These are the nine factors that contribute to emotional and mental stability.

1. Absence of suspicion and resentment. Grudges cause unhappiness.
2. Living in the present and future. Unhappiness stems from preoccupation with past mistakes and failures
3. Not wasting time and energy fighting things you cannot change.
4. Cooperate with life instead of trying to demolish it or run away from it.
5. Forcing yourself to be outgoing with others rather than isolating during times of stress.
6. Refusing to pity yourself or seek easy alibis that appear "noble" to yourself and others.
7. Cultivating the old fashioned virtues of love, honor, loyalty and thrift.
8. Not expecting too much of yourself. Dwelling on the gap between expectations and achievements causes unhappiness. Lower your demands on yourself.
9. Find something bigger than yourself in which to believe.
Self-centered, egotistical, materialistic people score lowest of all in any test measuring unhappiness.

Things heard around the rooms and mentioned above: Resentments, living in the present, the things you cannot change, don't isolate, self pity, expectations, a Higher Power. Sounds like AA offers us suggestions for getting happy as well as for getting sober.

The A.A. Tradition

Tradition Three

Our membership ought to include all who suffer from alcoholism. Hence we may refuse none who wish to recover. Nor ought A.A. membership ever depend upon money or conformity. Any two or three alcoholics gathered together for sobriety may call themselves an A.A. group, provided that, as a group, they have no other affiliation.

The Third Tradition is a sweeping statement indeed; it takes in a lot of territory. Some people might think it too idealistic to be practical. It tells every alcoholic in the world that he may become, and remain, a member of Alcoholics Anonymous *as long as he says so*. In short, Alcoholics Anonymous has no membership rule.

Why is this so? Our answer is simple and practical. Even in self-protection, we do not wish to erect the slightest barrier between ourselves and the fellow alcoholic who still suffers. We know that society has been demanding that he conform either to the laws of man or God. If he is anything, the sick alcoholic is a rebellious nonconformist. How well we understand that; every member of Alcoholics Anonymous was once a rebel himself. Hence we cannot offer to meet him at any halfway mark. We must enter the dark cave where he is and show him that we understand. We realize that he is altogether too weak and confused to jump hurdles. If we raise obstacles, he might stay away and perish. He might be denied his priceless opportunity.

Our membership tradition does contain, however, one vitally important qualification. That qualification relates to the use of our name, Alcoholics Anonymous. We believe that any two or three alcoholics gathered together for sobriety may call themselves an AA group provided that, as a group, they have no other affiliation. One can think of no AA member who would like, for example, to see the formation of "dry" AA groups, "wet" AA groups, Republican AA groups, communist AA groups. Few, if any, would wish our groups to be designated by religious denominations. We cannot lend the AA name, even indirectly, to other activities, however worthy. If we do so we shall become hopelessly compromised and divided. We think that AA should offer its experience to the whole world for whatever use can be made of it. But not its name. Nothing could be more certain.
