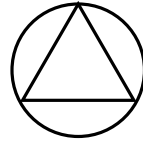

THE GROUCH AND THE BRAINSTORM

Resentments, they say, are the number one offender for an alcoholic. Through the fog of my early recovery I remember thinking how silly you people were. Isn't alcohol the number one offender? Maybe there were some instances where I overreacted, maybe I even owed an apology, but I certainly would not subscribe to the idea that my feelings toward the evils of the world were anything less than justified. Defiantly I asked where my responsibility lies in the abuse I suffered as a child, and the anger I harbored from that abandonment and neglect. I demanded to know where in the Big Book that was explained. Finally, I met a kind soul who was neither afraid of nor deterred by my incessant demands. He said, "Friend, your responsibility doesn't lie in the terrible ways you suffered as a child. You have my sincerest sympathy for that. But here you are, 45 years later letting those events define your every move. You've been so consumed with anger that you've no room for love. If you have no love, you certainly can't give any away. Perhaps without the anger, you wouldn't have the shame."

And just like that, it made sense. My responsibility was that I carried that anger for so long that I deeply hurt everyone around me. My own children didn't feel my love, because I had none to give. That regret, along with the realization of all the shameful things I had done in my past, kept me drunk. Something had to be done. That man explained, without blame, that although I had no choice in the initial hurt, I had a choice to quiet the brainstorm. I had a way out that would lead to emotional sobriety as well as physical. It was to be a long road, but one worth the distance.

If I was to live to good use, I had to be free of anger. The grouch and the brainstorm were not for me. They may be the dubious luxury of normal men, but for alcoholics these things are poison. No longer must I tempt my alcoholism with deep resentment. I receive so much love today, and have plenty to give. My brainstorm has turned into a quiet breeze and I owe my peace directly to you, my fellows, for leading me into the sunlight.

FROM THE ARCHIVES

A part of the material stored in the Archives is a collection of World Directories published by the General Service Office in New York. We have a directory of the groups in Florida that were registered with New York in 1948. A copy of this booklet is in a loose-leaf notebook and is part of the Archives exhibit at Intergroup functions. We now also have a copy of the World Directory – Spring, 1963 available for exhibit at functions. All directories list the name and contact information for a member (GSR) of each group.

The entire collection includes these directories as well as one from Fall, 1965. Our collection of booklets then begins again in 1980 and goes through 1995. The earlier directories consist of only one booklet, but by 1980 the AA population was so large that it required a separate booklet each for the Eastern US, the Western US, a Canadian Directory and an International Directory.

In each directory is a summary of the AA population at the time:

1948: US members – **67,850**; Groups – **2,429**

Other countries: Groups – **23**

1963: Total members – **209,434**; Groups – **10,956**

US members – 122,483; Groups – 7,033

Canada members – 15,410; Groups – 1,075

Outside US and Canada members – 32,071; Groups – 1,690

1980: Total members – **868,171**; Groups – **39,964**

US members – **387,875**; Groups – **20,359**

1995: Total members – **1,791,528**; Groups – **89,239**

US members – **1,127,471**; Groups – **49,443**

2010: Total members – **1,852,068**; Groups – **106,493**

US members – **1,030,953**; Groups – **48,020**

Point of interest: Although the total world membership and groups increased from 1995 to 2010, in the US membership and number of groups has decreased.

Each Alcoholics Anonymous group ought to be a spiritual entity *having but one primary purpose* – that of carrying its message to the alcoholic who still suffers.

Says the old proverb, "Shoemaker, stick to thy last." Trite, yes. But very true for us of AA. How well we need to heed the principle that it is better to do one thing supremely well than many things badly.

Because it has now become plain enough that only a recovered alcoholic can do much for a sick alcoholic, a tremendous responsibility has descended upon us all, an obligation so great that it amounts to a sacred trust. For to our kind, those who suffer alcoholism, recovery is a matter of life and death. So the society of Alcoholics Anonymous cannot, it dare not, ever be diverted from its primary purpose.

Temptations to do otherwise will come aplenty. Seeing fine works afoot in the field of alcohol, we shall be sorely tempted to loan out the name and credit of Alcoholics Anonymous to them; as a movement we shall be beset to finance and endorse other causes. Should our present success continue, people will commence to assert that AA is a brand-new way of life, maybe a new religion, capable of saving the world. We shall be told it is our burden duty to show modern society how it ought to live. Fantastic, you say, yet some of our well-wishers have begun to say such things.

Fortunately, most of us are convinced that these are perilous speculations, alluring ingredients of that new heady wine we are now being offered, each bottle marked "Success"!

Of this subtle vintage may we never drink too deeply. May we never forget that we live by the grace of God – on borrowed time; that anonymity is better than acclaim; that for us as a movement poverty is better than wealth.

And may we reflect with ever deepening conviction, that we shall never be at our best except when we hew only to the primary spiritual aim of AA. That of carrying its message to the alcoholic who still suffers alcoholism.
