A Program of Action

When I first came around the program, I was still looking for the "secret" – that special knowledge that others seemed to have that enabled them to stay sober. I figured once I learned the secret, I would adjust my thinking accordingly and go forward living a sober life. In those early meetings, I kept hearing the phrase, "my best thinking got me here" and had no idea what that meant.

Then one night, an older man named Moe, who was a respected doctor in the community, came up to me after a meeting and said, "My sponsor told me to take you out for coffee." Eager to make his acquaintance, and possibly learn the "secret," I immediately said yes. For thirty minutes or so, we had a good conversation, the specifics of which I do not remember. But at the end our conversation, Moe took out a felt-tipped pen and wrote the following onto a paper napkin: "You cannot think your way into sober living. You must live your way into sober thinking." I took that napkin home and taped it to my bedroom mirror. For the next two and half years, I read those two sentences every single day. Fortunately, I also got very active in the program. I attended tons of meetings, got a home group, got a sponsor, called my sponsor, went through the steps with my sponsor, learned to pray, read daily meditations, and did lots of service work. Slowly but surely, by taking the actions necessary to nurture my sobriety, my thinking began to change for the better. I began to recognize character defects or bad thoughts when they cropped up and learned how to short-circuit them with the Serenity Prayer or a call to my sponsor. Sometimes, I would even "intuitively know how to handle situations which used to baffle me."

Looking back, I realize that I was given the "secret" that night on a paper napkin. I learned that my thinking and my poor decisions got me deeper and deeper into the mess I was in, until finally, "under the lash of alcoholism, I was driven to AA." There, I learned that my thinking, even with more self knowledge, was not going to get me out of my mess. Instead, I had to take daily action to stay sober and to help other alcoholics. Only by doing what others did to live sober did I start to change my alcoholic thinking.

Report of the National Archives Workshop in Cocoa Beach, Florida Friday, Oct 5, 2012

Copyright law and Fair Use by Don F. of West Palm Beach

This presentation underlined the importance of honesty, integrity and knowledge of the law when collecting material for the Archives. Copyright is in effect for 70 years after the death of the author or 90 years on anonymous material. To comply with copyright law, you must have the express written permission of the author for any quotation longer than a few words in books, recordings or media. Ideas, data, procedures and systems are not covered by copyright.

Richmond Walker-His life and Writing by Dave W. of Daytona Beach, Florida An Excellent presentation by Dave which describes events in Richmond Walker's life and relates these events back to quotes which are found in the 24 Hour a Day book. Michael discussed the difficulties encounter because of hurricane Katrina and the retrieval and restoration process needed afterwards as well as the considerations to be taken into account when relocating the collection after the hurricane.

AA on the Nile – Literally (Part 2)

My friend arrived, the ropes were untied, and the meeting continued as we drifted out into the river. These boats have no engine and no paddles - they operate solely by wind power. And the boatmaster is an expert - as soon as we left the dock he lowered the boom and sail (normal sailboats have a fixed boom that stays at the bottom - and the sail is raised from there. These boats have a boom that is raised and lowered with the sail) and then guided us upwind (and down river) for about half an hour. Then he turned the boat so we were going with the wind, and straight into the nearly full moon that was beginning to rise from the evening haze over Cairo. The temperature was perfect - one of the rare cool nights in June - somewhere in the 70's I'm guessing - and there was a beautiful breeze blowing.

The topic was peace, of course - and there were many good things said about how AA provides us with so much peace, as compared to how we used to live.

So there I was, in this unbelievable place - on an ancient sailing boat, in the middle of the Nile River in early June, sharing my experience, strength and hope with others and then listening to them do the same as I felt the breeze blowing, heard the giant sail flapping in the wind, and watched the moon slowly rise over Egypt. We recited the Serenity Prayer in the middle of the meeting (usually it is recited at the end of meetings here - the Lord's Prayer hasn't quite caught on in this predominantly Muslim country - not sure why!), and then continued sharing until we approached the dock. The boatmaster returned the boat to its mooring expertly - with nary a trace of a bump against the other boats. He tied the rope, we departed, and the meetings-after-the-meeting continued for some time. Can't wait to do this again next Tuesday evening! I'm back in my apartment now, ready to crash and have another new day in the classroom tomorrow. I'll be flying home to Michigan in a couple of weeks, and then back here in August to re-start this fantastic adventure.

Any of you remember Marge? She was absolutely correct - the joy IS in the journey!!
Don't drink, and go to meetings. Ask God in your morning meditation how you can be of service to others -
and there is no telling where you may find yourself!
