Above all, I was suffering inner pain because my performance and my accomplishments in life failed to live up to my own expectations of myself.

I had to anesthetize that pain with alcohol. Of course, the more I drank, the more unrealistic my expectations became and the poorer my performance, and the gap widened. So the need to drink grew still greater.

The above quote really hits home with me...it explains why my drinking kept growing progressively worse as time went on. The more I expected of myself and others, the more disappointed and angry I became. Alcohol was the only thing that helped me numb all that. Over time the disease only got worse, people left my life because of what I expected of them and life kept getting harder and harder to bear. I believe that God intervened in my life by sending me to the one friend I had left the day that I was willing to hear what he had to say and the rest, as they say, is history.

I am learning that when I expect more than any human can give from myself or others I am setting myself up for huge resentments. Having carried major resentments with me for most of my life I now find that I can't handle that burden. So I continue to remind myself not to expect anything that isn't freely given.

It's so much easier to live with no expectations than to carry all the stuff around in my head and continue to relive disappointments over and over again. Life is serene when I live the AA way with my Higher Power as guide.

FROM THE ARCHIVES

This is another of the bits and pieces in the miscellaneous files found in the archives. It is quite general in content and could apply to sponsoring in any twelve step program. There is no source listed for this piece and I would be interested in knowing where it originated.

STEPS OF A SPONSOR

1. *I will not help you stay and wallow in limbo.*
2. I will help you grow, to be more productive, by your own definition.
3. I will help you become more autonomous, more loving of yourself...
4. I cannot give you dreams or "fix you up", simply because I cannot.
5. I cannot give you growth or grow for you. You must grow yourself by facing reality...
6. I cannot take away the loneliness or pain.
7. I cannot sense your world for you, evaluate your goals or tell what is best for you in your world; you have your own world.
8. I cannot convenience you of the crucial choice of choosing the scary uncertainty of growing over the safe misery of not growing.
9. I want to be with you and know you as a rich and growing friend, yet I cannot get close to you when you choose not to grow.
10. When I begin to care for you out of pity, when I begin to lose trust in you then I am toxic, bad and inhibiting for you and you for me.
11. You must know - my help is conditional. I will be with you, hang in there with you as long as I continue to get even the slightest hints that you are trying to grow.
12. If you can accept all of this then perhaps we can help each other to become what God meant us to be – mature adults, leaving childishness forever to little children.

"Our public relations policy is based on attraction that than promotion; we need always maintain personal anonymity at the level of press, radio and films."

"Alcoholics who have recovered through our program are themselves the strongest attraction that AA has. When people are asked what led them to seek AA help, the answer given most often is: "An AA member.""

"Suppose a sick alcoholic never had the good fortune to meet an AA. How is such a person going to find us? The search will be difficult if the local group thinks it should be anonymous, too. The Tradition is talking about "*personal* anonymity", remember? Alcoholics will not be attracted to AA if they don't know that it exists or if they have distorted, unfavorable impressions of its members or its program."
