ON AWAKENING

My first five years of sobriety were almost a blur. I came in at the ripe old age of 24, and my maturity level was that of a 13 year old. I remember doing the steps, barely learning the traditions, and sponsoring one guy. I remember making a lot of friends and also making people in the rooms quite mad at me as well! I was so energetic to spread the good word of the program! Sometimes that energy came out as evangelic and harsh as I was learning how to better my relationships with humans. Gratefully, I finally had enough experience in living the program that I needed to go do my steps again thanks to some self justified anger and quite a few new resentments, as well as a few old ones I thought I had better write about some more.

This is where I found one of the most of the important things to read in the Big Book. I must of glazed over it in the beginning, or just not heard it in all the Big Book Meetings I attended. Go figure. Here is where I remember reading pages 86-88 in its glory. I remember the feeling it brought me when I finally READ it. My sponsor told me it was part of his daily program and it helped keep him focused on his dependence on God. Well, I thought it should then be implemented as part of my daily ritual as well. What a surprise to me to find out how well it worked upon starting off every morning reading it from "On awakening" until it ended on page 88.

Things started to change. I started feeling calmer throughout the day. I started to talk more to my Higher Power as the day went on. I realized I wasn't so quick to have an attitude or temper. I was more pleasant in my communication with other people. I started thinking what I could do to make things better for others instead of my dreams and aspirations in self-centeredness. I began to feel more of my will directed to God's care than my own. Basically, I like to say that my footprint on the world got vastly

gentler. No longer was I kicking up dirt (drama) all around me and fixing the mess afterwards. I started relying on that God intuition to find solutions to everyday issues that would arise and I felt confident that I made the correct decision. This was a major turning point in my sobriety. I finally understood the meaning of serenity and could tap into it on a regular basis far more than I ever did before.

Reading these pages almost every morning changed me for the better. It says on the last page that we are undisciplined, and that God helps discipline us in this simple way. In those few pages, they tell me to: Let God direct my thinking, ask God for intuition, have God show me what the next step to take is, and finally, to ask for His will to be done instead of mine. Sounds to me like a great roadmap to the whole "Happy, Joyous, and Free" feeling we get when we work this program the way the Big Book outlined for us!

FROM THE ARCHIVES – WAY OF LIFE GROUP

The Way of Life Group was first listed with GSO in 1978 as the Serenity Group. It was meeting at the Congregational Church in Holly Hill and the contacts listed were Richard B. and Wayne H. (who soon would start Serenity House and Club YANA.) In 1979 the group met at the First Methodist Church on Bay Street and the contact was Ethel Q. The group moved March 6, 1979 to the Almous Club to meet on Sunday at 6:30 pm. This did not work out because it interfered with the Sunday 8:30 pm meeting so the group then moved to Monday at noon and changed its name to the Way of Life Group. The group met at noon at the Almous Club Monday, Thursday and Saturday. In 1980 group contacts were Ralph C. and Ruth R. In 1981 Grace R. was listed as GSR.

Shirley F. - with the assistance of Ida T. - has submitted this note to the Archives committee describing the history of the Way of Life Group:

"I'm a fairly new member of the Way of Life group and tried to get information about the group. A very nice lady named Ida T. helped me gather information about the early days. I am honored to be a member of this group and proud to belong. The group does what it needs to do and is very willing to help a newcomer. We are always there to reach a hand out.

We meet 6 days a week and have a variety of meetings. On Monday we have a 12 Step and 12 Tradition study, Tuesday is Open Discussion, Wednesday is a Big Book study, Thursday is a speaker meeting and Friday and Saturday are Open Discussion meetings. We have about 90 members so there are lots of anniversary meetings. We offer coffee and sometimes a snack and always have a smile or a hug for you.

I want to thank everyone for making me feel welcome and that I belong. Come in for a meeting and get to know us."

Group activities have included a coffee clubhouse on Main Street, picnics at Ponce Inlet, softball games and dances with a DJ. We usually hold a Thanksgiving Dinner at the Almous Club.

There is a list of at least 40 founding and early members included with this note, too numerous to include here. All information on this group is available in the Group History book in the Archives.

Thank you to Shirley F. and Ida T. for this wonderful history of the Way of Life Group, one of the very strong groups in our area.

The A.A. Tradition

Tradition Eleven

Our relations with the general public should be characterized by personal anonymity. We think A.A. ought to avoid sensational advertising. Our names and pictures as A.A. members ought not be broadcast, filmed, or publicly printed. Our public relations should be guided by the principle of attraction rather than promotion. There is never need to praise ourselves. We feel it better to let our friends recommend us.

Good public relations are AA lifelines reaching out to the alcoholic who still does not know us. For years to come, our growth is sure to depend upon the strength and number of these lifelines. One serious public relations calamity could always turn thousands away from us to perish – a matter of life and death indeed!

The future poses no greater problem or challenge to AA than how best to preserve a friendly and vital relation to all the world about us. Success will rest heavily upon the right principles, a wise vigilance, and the deepest personal responsibility on the part of every one of us. Nothing less will do. Else our brother may again turn his face to the wall because we did not care enough.

So the Eleventh Tradition stands sentinel over the lifelines, announcing that there is no need for self-praise, that is better to let our friends recommend us, and that our whole public relations policy, contrary to usual customs, should be based upon the principle of *attraction* rather than promotion. Shot-in-the-arm methods are not for us – no press agents, no promotional devices, no big names. The hazards are too great. Immediate results will always be illusive because easy shortcuts to notoriety can generate permanent and smothering liabilities.

More and more, therefore, are we emphasizing the principle of personal anonymity as it applies to our public relations. We ask of each other the highest degree of personal responsibility in this respect. As a movement we have been, before now, tempted to exploit the names of our well-known public characters. We have rationalized that other societies, even the best, do the same. As individuals, we have sometimes believed that the public use of our names could demonstrate our personal courage in the face of stigma, so lending power and conviction to news stories and magazine articles.

But these are not the allures they once were. Vividly, we are becoming aware that no member ought to describe himself in full view of the general public as an AA, even for the most worthy purpose, lest a perilous precedent be set which would tempt others to do likewise for purposes not so worthy.

So it is becoming our code that there are things that no AA ever does, lest he divert AA from its sole purpose and injure our public relations. And thereby the chances of those sick ones yet to come.

Archives Committee by Carolyn C: We now have the DVD from GSO "Markings on the Journey" which is a brief history of AA told with material from the Archives as GSO. It is 30 minutes long and could be set up to run on the laptop at various events. It is going to be used as the program for the Wednesday Women's Brown Bag luncheon on Oct 8th.

Bambi has donated copies of papers from the Bill Wilson house in Vermont. There is an article "The First 40 and the 75% Success Among Them" by Dick B., the names of the first 240 members and a list of the stories in the Big Book and information about the authors of each. The papers have been added to the notebook containing the short bios of *Who's Who in AA and Early AA History*.

Phone Army Coordinator by Julie G: There were 9 info calls and 1 help call reported by Phone Army volunteers.
