FROM THE ARCHIVES

What is a “can opener”?

In AA Archives speak, a “can opener” is a small pamphlet, handout or one sheet (rarely a booklet) compiled by a group to provide information about AA to the newcomer. The can openers appeared in the late 30’s and continued to be produced until the late 40’s. These little gems are not conference approved and all are unique to the group which produced them. They are all different with the same purpose; they carry the message. “Can openers” may contain meeting times and places, information about what AA is and how it works, personal stories of members as well as endorsements from doctors and clergymen in the community.

When Works Publishing started to produce informative material about AA, it was expensive to get these large booklets from the New York office. Money always being a problem, groups continued to produce their own. With the advent of the Central Offices in large cities, these offices started to produce the beginners information pamphlets.

Why are they called “can openers?” They are a lever to pry open closed minds. The hope is that a can opener will let the hot air out so the AA message can come in.

Although we have no actual “can openers” in our collection, we do have several of the beginners information pamphlets of recent origin produced by Central Offices.

Does your group have a literature chair? General Service Representative or Intergroup Rep?

These are important jobs and functions of AA, not politics, but the way in which we reach each other and our primary purpose- to help the still suffering alcoholic. So, how has this come about? Books, pamphlets, service materials all working their way into the hands of alcoholics. The literature, clear and distinct, providing solutions to sufferers caught in alcoholism’s grip. Many would say it begins — like most things in A.A. — with the group, where skeptical and shaky newcomers are introduced to A.A.’s many helpful resources. So, does your group have a literature chair? Someone to show members the wide variety of Conference-approved materials, to recommend pamphlets to interested newcomers looking for a means of instant identification, to set up literature displays or put packets together of materials especially helpful for beginners? The General Service Conference felt it was important that groups be encouraged to appoint literature chairs back in 1968 and passed an Advisory Action stating: “In an effort to strengthen our network of literature representatives to ensure that A.A. literature is available at meetings, as well as catalog order forms for books and cassettes that individuals are likely to want, it is suggested that groups appoint literature coordinators.”

PI/CPC committee meets the first Monday of each month at 6pm just prior to the District 32 meeting and we invite and challenge each group to identify a literature chair and join us for the committee meeting. Any and all are invited to join us in service as there are many other jobs and tasks related to public information and cooperation with the professional community in need of support by YOU and those YOU sponsor...

The Tenth Tradition

"Alcoholics Anonymous has no opinion on outside issues; hence the AA name ought never be drawn into public controversy."

A member shares: "I am writing to express concern about a trend that I have seen in meetings over the last year. Several members have been criticizing religious institutions. People say that they are "recovering Catholics" or "recovering Baptists". Many people say they did not find God in church, they only found God in AA.

The long form of Tradition 10 states:

"No AA group or member should ever, in such a way as to implicate AA, express any opinion on outside controversial issues—particularly those of politics, alcohol reform, or sectarian religion. The Alcoholics Anonymous groups oppose no one. Concerning such matters they can express no views whatever."

Bill had good cause for this tradition. Most of the original 100 were church members.

About two years ago I spoke with a newcomer. This person was very active in church and was discouraged about returning to AA after hearing people belittle his church. I tried to explain that we are not anti-religion; we wish him well if his church shows him a path to his higher power. He was a little skeptical because that was not what he heard expressed in the meeting, and neither did I.

I do not think people are trying to be offensive, but we may ask them to consider their comments to a newcomer with church association. This issue might be addressed as a matter of group conscience if you are experiencing a pattern of these comments." (anonymous)

This has seriously made me examine my conscience about what and how I share in meetings! How about you?
