### RESPONSIBILITY REVISITED

**When anyone, anywhere reaches out for help, I want the hand of AA always to be there, and for that, I am responsible.**

Being fairly new to AA this time around, I had to really think about this statement. Being a US military veteran, college educated and living on my own since I was sixteen, I always had a self-centered belief that I was responsible. I provided for my own family, paid my bills on time and was a law-abiding citizen. I held credentials and clearances that very few were able to attain. That was, however, until I crossed that fine line from social drinking to becoming a full blown alcoholic.

Within a matter of months my life spiraled downhill and I flew through the gates of hell. I lost everything, my family, my career, but most of all, I lost myself. I have been one of the chronic relapsers of AA. In and out, swearing to never drink again, then before I knew it, all bets were off and I picked up once again. Sometimes just one, and sometimes I had that long binger that only by the grace of God I was able to recover from.

Being in and out of the rooms of AA, the Responsibility Statement was something I read, but never really thought about. Being presented with the opportunity to write about what it meant to me and how it has helped me made me think back to the very first time I was introduced to AA. I called the 800 number I found listed in a phone book. Being as desperate as the dying can be, I made that life changing phone call. A man answered the phone and I told him my situation. That man got me in touch with a woman who, within hours, showed up at my house with another female member of AA. The first thing they did was dump everything in my house containing alcohol, including mouthwash and vanilla extract. They sat with me, talked with me, and asked me if I wanted to go to a meeting. And so I did. I was shaking, puking and could barely stand, but they sat me down right between them and told me I never had to feel that way again. (cont. inside)

### FROM THE ARCHIVES

In our inventory of trifolds from GSO is a flyer *The A.A. Archives* and it is labeled "Service Piece."

Topics briefly covered by the folder are:

**"Why does an anonymous program need archives?"** Bill w. wrote, "We are trying to build up extensive records that will be of value to future historians...and factual material will be placed in our files to prevent distortion" of our history.

**"What are AA Archives?"** Archives consist of any historical collection at the level of group, district, area, intergroup/central office, region or the General Service Office. Collections vary but usually consist of written and audiovisual material, minutes, newsletters, books, photographs, sound recordings and more.

**"How are local archives paid for?"** The archives equipment, supplies, a computer, shelving and furniture, expenses for travel of the archivist and other needs are part of the overall budget expense of the area/district/intergroup. The archives is seen as an integral part of Twelfth Step Service.

**"How do local archives grow?"** AA's interested in our past willingly contribute archival materials to the local archives committees in their area. Searching for old archive material is productive but also "what is produced today will be tomorrow's archives."

**"Who takes care of the archives?"** Archives committees usually include A.A. members who are knowledgeable about AA's history and the service structure, as well as those who simply want to help. The archivist usually does not rotate frequently. The Archives Committee establishes budgets, policies and procedures and has final responsibility for the management of the archives through its group conscience.

**"How can you help?"** Ask oldtimers to tape their stories. Create a history of your home group, why and when it started and events connected with its history. Volunteer your time to help with the filing, sorting and organizing material in the archives.

**"How is the Anonymity Tradition observed?"** The trustee's Archives Committee, in 1975 made this statement. "any AA member may view the original of any material that has been previously printed or published" and with approval may conduct research using unpublished material. Also recommended –no photocopying/scanning of unpublished material to insure anonymity.

**"How do AA archives help carry the message of recovery?"** The archives express AA's collective experience, strength and hope renewing our own sense of purpose. We sort out fact from fiction and ensure that our program of recovery will continue undiluted and true.

The trifold *The A.A. Archives* will be available at the district/intergroup service workshops, at intergroup events where the archives are displayed and from the Archives room at intergroup.

### Tradition Ten

**No A.A. group or member should ever, in such a way as to implicate A.A., express any opinion on outside controversial issues – particularly those of politics, alcohol reform, or sectarian religion. The Alcoholics Anonymous groups oppose no one. Concerning such matters they can express no views whatever.**

To most of us, Alcoholics Anonymous has become as solid as the Rock of Gibraltar. We like to believe that it will soon be as well known and just as enduring as that historic landmark. We enjoy this pleasant conviction because nothing has yet occurred to disturb it; we reason that we must hang together or die. Hence we take for granted our continued unity as a movement.

But should we? Though God has bestowed upon us great favors, and though we are bound by stronger ties of love and necessity than most societies, is it prudent to suppose that automatically these great gifts and attributes shall be ours forever? If we are worthy, we shall probably continue to enjoy them. So the real question is, how shall we always be worthy of our present blessings?

Political controversy and reform by compulsion have reached an all-time high. And eternal, seemingly, are the flames of religious dissension. Our best defense? This surely lies in the formation of a Tradition respecting serious controversy so powerful that neither the weakness of persons nor the strain and strife of our troubled times can harm Alcoholics Anonymous. We know that AA must continue to live, or else many of us and many of our fellow alcoholics throughout the world will surely resume the hopeless journey to oblivion. That must never be.

As though by some deep and compelling instinct, we have thus far avoided serious controversies. Save minor and healthy growing pains, we are at peace among ourselves. And because we have thus far adhered to our sole aim, the whole world regards us favorably.

May God grant us the wisdom and fortitude ever to sustain an unbreakable unity.
