HEARD IN MEETINGS

Sometimes we hear things in meetings that are said so often that they can lose their meaning. Sometimes we misunderstand. Sometimes people misquote the literature. Here are some things I've often heard in meetings and some quotes taken directly from the Big Book of Alcoholics Anonymous that helped me gain some clarity.

Heard - **This is a selfish program.** BB - "Selfishness - self centeredness! This, we think, is the root of our troubles." p.62

Heard - **I haven't had a drink today, so I am a complete success.** Some days, that's the best we can do, but as we work the program, the Big Book tells us that "The elimination of drinking is but a beginning. A much more important demonstration of our principles lies before us in our respective homes, occupations and affairs." p.19

Heard - **I don't feel good. I need a meeting.** Meetings afford us the ability to connect with other alcoholics in recovery. But we can't forget that "nothing will so much ensure immunity from drinking as intensive work with other alcoholics. It works when other activities fail." p.89 "I was not too well at the time, and was plagued with waves of self-pity and resentment. This sometimes nearly drive me back to drink, but I soon found that when all other measures failed, working with another alcoholic would save the day. Many times I have gone to my old hospital in despair. On talking to a man there, I would be amazingly lifted up and set on my feet. It is a design for living that works in rough going." p.15

Heard - **If making an amend harms me, I shouldn't make it. I can consider myself as one of the "others" mentioned in Step 9.** BB - "Reminding ourselves that we have decided to go to any lengths to find a spiritual experience, we ask that we be given strength and direction to do the right thing, no matter what the personal consequences may be." p.79

Heard - **Never pray for patience. You might regret it.** BB - "So clean house with the family, asking each morning in meditation that our Creator show us the way of patience, tolerance, kindness and love." p.83

Heard - **Your Higher Power can be whatever you want it to be: a door knob, a soda can, a light bulb, anything!** While sometimes this is a good start and a necessary beginning to our spiritual development, the Big Book tells us that, "The great fact is this, and nothing less: That we have had deep and effective spiritual experiences which have revolutionized our whole attitude toward life, toward our fellows and toward God's universe. The central fact of our lives today is the absolute certainty that our Creator has entered into our hearts and lives in a way that is indeed miraculous. He has commenced to accomplish those things for us that we could never do by ourselves." p.25

FROM THE ARCHIVES

Part of the Archives collection consists of samples of the various trifold and bi-fold cards published by GSO as well as cards published by Intergroups and AA groups from across the country. Among the GSO cards is the wallet card with the Serenity prayer, 12 Steps, 12 Traditions and the Preamble. Another published by GSO is "What Does Anonymity Mean to A.A?" which has Tradition Eleven and Twelve and statements about anonymity.

Most of the cards and small items have just "appeared" in the archives and this notebook collection is a place to preserve and store them for future reference. There is no publisher or date noted on some of the cards; for example: a picture postcard from Bill W's house in Vermont and a bi-fold from the Archives display from 2000 in Minneapolis.

One interesting bi-fold is current and can be purchased at the intergroup office for 10 cents. There is no date or publisher listed on this little bit of wisdom. It is called "15 POINTS FOR AN ALCOHOLIC TO CONSIDER WHEN CONFRONTED WITH THE URGE TO TAKE A DRINK." There are 5 points which start with "Cultivate" and describe attitudes which are important to staying sober, the main one being "Gratitude". There are several points which warn of the self-pity modes a newly sober person can think themselves into. A few points stress the positive elements in being sober. The final point is the one which describes how important AA can be in our lives.

The A.A. Tradition

Tradition Nine

Each A.A. group needs the least possible organization. Rotating leadership is the best. The small group may elect its secretary, the large group its rotating committee, and the groups of a large metropolitan area their central or intergroup committee, which often employs a full-time secretary. The trustees of the General Service Board are, in effect, our A.A. General Service Committee. They are the custodians of our A.A. Tradition and the receivers of voluntary A.A. contributions by which we maintain our A.A. General Service Office at New York. They are authorized by the groups to handle our overall public relations and they guarantee the integrity of our principal newspaper, the A.A. Grapevine. All such representatives are to be guided in the spirit of service, for true leaders in A.A. are but trusted and experienced servants of the whole. They derive no real authority from their titles; they do not govern. Universal respect is the key to their usefulness.

The least possible organization, that's our universal ideal. No fees, no dues, no rules imposed on anybody, one alcoholic bringing recovery to the next; that's the substance of what we most desire, isn't it?

We have, for example, the kind of AA who is for simplicity. Terrified of anything organized, he tells us that AA is getting too complicated. He thinks money only makes trouble, committees only make dissension, elections only make politics, paid workers only make professionals, and clubs only coddle slippers.

Quite opposed to such halcyon simplicity is the AA promoter. Left to himself, he would "bang the cannon and twang the lyre" at every crossroad of the world. Millions for drunks, great AA hospitals, batteries of paid organizers, and publicity experts wielding all the latest paraphernalia of sound and script; such would be our promoters dream.

For one, I'm glad we have both conservatives and enthusiasts. The conservative will surely see to it that the AA movement never gets overly organized. But the promoter will continue to remind us of our terrific obligation to the newcomer and to those hundreds of thousands of alcoholics still waiting all over the world to hear of AA.

We shall, naturally, take the firm and safe middle course. AA has always violently resisted the idea of any general organization. Yet, paradoxically, we have ever stoutly insisted upon organizing certain *special services*; mostly those absolutely necessary to effective and plentiful Twelfth Step work.

As such facts and distinctions become clear, we shall easily lay aside our fears of blighting organization or hazardous wealth. As a movement, we shall remain comfortably poor, for our service expenses are trifling.

With such assurances, we shall without doubt continue to improve and extend our vital lifelines of special service; to better carry our AA message to others; to make for ourselves a finer, greater Society, and, God willing, to assure Alcoholics Anonymous a long life and perfect unity.

COMMITTEES, COORDINATORS AND INTERGROUP UPDATES

Office Coordinator's Report by Mike D: There were a total of 57 calls and 218 visits to Intergroup for July 2014. There were five calls for a ride to a meeting, one person wanted a 12 step for her sister, one person was looking for an intervention, and one wanted help for her son.

We have desk volunteers for the second and third Saturdays currently in training. Thanks to all for their efforts in recruiting.

The price increase from World Services will be effective October 1, 2014. Price increase varies per book. The standard Big Book and 12 & 12 will increase by \$1.50. Prices at Intergroup will stay the same until we have to order inventory at the new prices.

Archives Committee by Carolyn C: We are continuing to scan important documents. The copying of tapes to CDs is progressing. Group histories are being sent to the Archives. The preservation of AA history in Volusia County continues.
