CHANGE

In the Doctor's Opinion in the Big Book, as I was studying the Big Book again, the antidote for recovery from alcoholism is stated thusly --- "...unless this person can experience an entire psychic change (also known as a "spiritual awakening") there is very little hope of his recovery."

Alright, it got me to thinking and writing again. What is a "psychic change," what is the nature of a "spiritual awakening?"

It is a very simple thing (although not easily achieved). It is simply a radical change in our system of beliefs, our belief system we have been living with and operating under all our life in the case of the alcoholic, a belief system based on fear and hate and illusion.

A very wise man once said there is one main rule for a very happy and successful life, "Love your neighbor as yourself." Ah-ha, therein lies the heart of the problem. I could not love myself, therefore could not truly love anything else. Consequently I developed an ego problem: I was either better than or less than, fearing and hating both aspects greater or less than myself, and creating illusions (self lies) to deal with my problems in life.

There are many formal belief systems (philosophies) in the world: humanism, existentialism, naturism, rationalism, non-rationalism, communism, etc.; all of which can be common in each person's thought system to some extent. All of which diminish the sovereignty of man in his own life and the lives of others as he tries to pull himself up by his own boot straps, forgetting the true sovereignty of a higher power of your own understanding.

Does the giant Oak Tree have a belief system? Does it not do God's will perfectly? When that tree was an acorn lying on the ground, it had all the information that it needed to fulfill God's will. **Don't you think God has given mankind all the same abilities?**

THE A.A. TRADITION NINE

A.A., as such, ought never be organized, but we may create service boards of committees directly responsible to those they serve.

The words "Let's keep it simple" were the last Bill W. heard from his fellow founder of A.A., shortly before Dr. Bob's death in 1950. Aware that "it" meant our recovery program, Bill later wrote, "We need to distinguish sharply between spiritual simplicity and functional simplicity. ...When we get into questions of action by groups, by areas, and by A.A. as a whole, we find that we must to some extent organize to carry the message—or else face chaos. And chaos is not simplicity."

But in "action by groups," we find that we do need some degree of organization. If everybody thinks somebody else is going to make the coffee, what's the result? No coffee! To avoid such a disaster, one or more members agree to be responsible for preparing meeting refreshments. All the way from coffee-brewers to trustees on the General Service Board, those who take part in A.A. service work are assuming responsibility—not taking on authority. (Here, Traditions Two and Nine interlock.) Group officers are responsible to the members of the group; intergroup committees, to the groups in one locality; institutions committees, to A.A. groups in treatment facilities and correctional facilities; area committees, to all groups in their areas; Conference delegates and committees, to all groups in the U.S. and Canada; the General Service Office and Board and the board's committees, to all groups and members everywhere.

And yet, with so small a degree of organization, A.A. miraculously does work! One reason may be that Tradition Five applies to each A.A. committee and board as directly as it does to each A.A. group. By cleaving to this "one primary purpose" in all its activities, the Fellowship retains "spiritual simplicity." To diffuse that purpose, to embroil A.A. in issues apart from its true concern, would create dangerous complications....

If we pray and meditate and practice the 12 Steps of A.A. to the best of our ability we will discover God's will for us. Keep it simple, learn to love, and we will always be doing God's will without conscious thought or effort.

Our constant struggle to make contact with our loving Creator is not easily achieved in organized religion, because typically organized religion does not understand the alcoholic's problem. The problem is the ego, the sum total of all the lies we have told ourselves. The elimination of ego is the answer. As the ego leaves, love rushes in to fill the void. That's how it works and the crux of the beginning of a complete psychic change.

All of A.A.'s 12 Steps and the fellowship are ego deflating spiritual guides that ultimately teach us how to love in all our affairs, as we discover and learn truly that we, each of us, is a localized intimate manifestation of the divinity of a power greater than ourselves.

It is my wish for each of you that this day be one of Grace and Gratitude, that you may know peace and be content, fully alive to the sufficiency and generosity of grace.

One golden day at a time, as we go with the flow, keeping our heads up and celebrating each other... These attributes of life are so easy and simple to attain, for they are our natural inheritance as we come to know and be the love that we truly are.
