A Design For Living That Works In Rough Going

"It works where other activities fail." (AA p.89) "...when all other measures failed, work with another alcoholic would save the day." (AA p. 15)

These quotes are referring to when we are tempted to drink, but I have found that there is more power here than Bill envisioned at the time. As well as helping me through a desire to drink, these words and subsequent actions have **helped me through the most trying times of my life.**

When I was 5 years sober I was diagnosed with a progressive, incurable, untreatable, and (what they thought at the time) fatal neuro-muscular disease. At the time, I thought seriously about a drink. Working intensely with other alcoholics saved me. Two years later, my 8 year old daughter had a series of strokes and passed away. This time I did not want to drink but I was in extreme emotional pain. On the way home from the burial on December 24th, instead of going home, I went to the Christmas Alcahthon. Soon an inebriated soul came in, and **I was blessed with the opportunity to work with him.** All this time my disease was progressing and the time for a wheelchair was rapidly approaching. The chance came to move from cold and snowy Massachusetts to warm and sunny Florida arose. It was incredibly exciting, but I was also gripped with fear. When I arrived in Florida, my wife got me to a meeting. **I jumped into A.A. with both feet joined a group and immediately got active.**

There is nothing more important than carrying this life saving message. Bill's words have been so true for me. "For if an alcoholic failed to perfect and enlarge his spiritual life through work and self-sacrifice for others, he could not survive the certain trials and low spots ahead." (AA pp. 14-15)

November 2016 Committees, Coordinators, & Volusia County Intergroup Updates

Office Coordinator's Report: There were a total of 32 calls and 162 visits to Volusia County Intergroup for October 2016. I've made several calls to potential volunteers, and have spoken with one who may be interested in working the front desk. Left messages for five other applicants and will continue the recruiting process. Dallas Ward, our tax accountant, continues to assist with financial and Quikbook training. Thanks also to Jim Oliver for his help with accounting procedures.

Archives Report: Archives display at Oldtimers dinner was a huge success. There was a lot of attention paid to the material and questions from the members. We received a special donation from Dana of Orange City. A silver medallion inscribed with "Duke, 1921-2005, Grateful A.A. member, 55 years 10 months." On the reverse side is the Serenity Prayer. This medal belonged to Les, Duke's best friend and shipmate in the merchant marine who passed a couple of years ago. We now have two members willing to do oldtimer interviews, Janine in Edgewater and Glenda in Daytona.

Phone Army Coordinator: There were no calls reported for October. We are still in need of a person to take over the position of Phone Army Coordinator.

From the Archives

Oldtimer interviews are in progress in the Edgewater-New Smyrna area and will begin after Christmas in the Daytona-Ormond area. The purpose of the interview is not only to honor our Oldtimers but to gather the history of A.A. in Volusia County. Therefore, the criteria that we have established for an interview is that the person being interviewed must have gotten sober in this area more than 20 years ago or they must have more than 20 years of sobriety in the area. Although it is always interesting to hear about how someone got sober in other areas of the country and should be included in the story, the emphasis should be on memories of A.A. in Volusia County.

Here are examples of the questions that are included in the interview process:

- How did you learn about A.A.?
- Where and when was your first A.A. contact?
- What was early A.A. like in your area?
- How was 12 step work done?
- Did you go on 12 step calls?
- What meetings or groups did you attend at the beginning or on coming to the area?
- What members were especially prominent in your sobriety in this area?
- What contributions did you make to the growth of the Fellowship in the service area? Start new meetings? Make coffee? Serve as GSR? Work at Intergroup?
- What special events do you recall? Social events? Conventions? Workshops?

These interviews are recorded, transferred to the Archives computer, stored in the cloud and a CD is burned and then they are transcribed and a paper copy is kept in the Archives room. *This project is an important part of the work of the Archives so any help is appreciated.*

P.S. We are always in need of someone to type these interviews from the CD's.

Step Twelve

“Having had a spiritual awakening as the result of these steps, we tried to carry this message to alcoholics, and to practice these principles in all our affairs.”

“For it is only by accepting and solving our problems that **we can begin to get right with ourselves and with the world about us, and with Him** who presides over us all. Understanding is the key to right principles and attitudes, and right action is the key to good living; therefore, *the joy of good living is the theme of A.A.’s Twelfth Step.*

With each passing day of our lives, may every one of us sense more deeply the inner meaning of A.A.’s simple prayer:

**God grant us the serenity to accept the things we cannot change,
Courage to change the things we can,
And wisdom to know the difference.”**

– Twelve Steps and Twelve Traditions, p. 125

Tradition Twelve

“Anonymity is the spiritual foundation of all our traditions, ever reminding us to place principles before personalities.”

TRADITIONS CHECKLIST from the A.A. Grapevine. These questions were originally published in the A.A. Grapevine in conjunction with a series on the Twelve Traditions that began in November 1969 and ran through September 1971. While they were originally intended primarily for individual use, many A.A. groups have since used them as a basis for wider discussion.

Questions to Ponder...

1. Why is it a good idea for me to place the common welfare of all A.A. members before individual welfare? What would happen to me if A.A. as a whole disappeared?
2. When I do not trust A.A.’s current servants, who do I wish had the authority to straighten them out?
3. In my opinions of and remarks about other A.A.’s, am I implying membership requirements other than a desire to stay sober?
4. Do I ever try to get a certain A.A. group to conform to my standards, not its own?
5. Have I a personal responsibility in helping an A.A. group fulfill its primary purpose? What is my part?
6. Does my personal behavior reflect the Sixth Tradition—or belie it?
7. Do I do all I can do to support A.A. financially? When is the last time I anonymously gave away a Grapevine subscription?
8. Do I complain about certain A.A.s’ behavior—especially if they are paid to work for A.A.? Who made me so smart?
9. Do I fulfill all A.A. responsibilities in such a way as to please privately even my own conscience? Really?
10. Do my utterances always reflect the Tenth Tradition, or do I give A.A. critics real ammunition?
11. Should I keep my A.A. membership a secret, or reveal it in private conversation when that may help another alcoholic (and therefore me)? Is my brand of A.A. so attractive that other drunks want it?
12. What is the real importance of me among more than a million A.A.s?

"She's the woman to please, never mind all the rest

 You may fool the whole world down the pathway of years
 And get pats on the back as you pass,
 But your final reward will be heartaches and tears
 If you've cheated the woman in the glass."

As the New Year approaches, I wish you all meaningful experiences and enhanced understanding of the knowledge of God's will. I pray that when you and I look into the glass, the reflection is that of a loving and honest friend.

4. Find out about the **special holiday parties, meetings, or other celebrations** given by groups in your area, and go. If you're timid, take someone newer than you are.
5. Skip any drinking occasion you are nervous about. Remember how clever you were at excuses when drinking. **Now put the talent to good use. No office party is as important as saving your life.**
6. If you have to go to a drinking party and can't take an A.A. with you, **keep some candy handy.**
7. Don't think you have to stay late. **Plan in advance** an "important date" you have to keep.
8. Go to church. Any church.
9. Don't sit around brooding. **Catch up on** those books, museums, walks, and letters.
10. Don't start now getting worked up about all those holiday temptations. Remember - "**one day at a time.**"
11. Enjoy the true beauty of holiday love and joy. Maybe you cannot give material gifts-but **this year, you can give love.**
12. "**Having had a ...**" **No need to spell out the Twelfth Step here, since you already know it.**
